UWM 2000-2001 SEASON IN REVIEW

**Game 1 - Iowa 83, UWM 79**

**Sun. Nov. 19 @ Iowa City, Iowa**

**IOWA CITY, Iowa** - The University of Iowa overcame a 15-point first half deficit, then had to fight off a valiant UWM effort down the stretch to claim an 83-79 victory.

UWM closed to within two points twice in the final minute - first on a running one-handed bank shot by Kalombo Kadima with 43.6 seconds to play, then again on a Chad Angeli layin with 14 seconds remaining. Dean Oliver made two free throws with 8.6 seconds remaining to account for the final margin.

Angeli led UWM with 23 points, while three other Panthers scored in double figures.

"We came in here with the idea that we could get this done," UWM coach Bo Ryan said. "I thought, in a year's time, we've improved in some areas. It just didn't show for 40 minutes tonight."

Iowa took the lead for the first time, 48-47, on a Luke Recker layin with 18:13 to play in the game. Recker followed with a three to give the Hawkeyes a four-point lead, and the first nine points of the second half. The Hawkeyes largest lead of the second half was seven - the final time coming at 73-66 with 6:25 to play.

UWM used a 23-9 run to build a 30-15 lead with 9:37 to play in the first half. But, Iowa countered, scoring 20 of the next 27 points to pull within 37-35 at the 3:58 mark, forcing a Panther timeout. The Panther lead again grew to 10 on a Dan Weisse three-point basket and free throw with a minute to play in the half, but Iowa scored the final five points of the first half to pull within 47-42 at halftime.

"I was very proud of the way our kids responded to the environment. It's a difficult place to play," Ryan said.

**Game 2 - UWM 74, Lipscomb 58**

**Tues. Nov. 21 @ Milwaukee, Wis.**

**MILWAUKEE, Wis.** - Chad Angeli scored 19 points as UWM pulled away from Lipscomb 74-58 Tuesday night at the Klotsche Center.

The Panthers (1-1) led 41-35 with 15:23 to play before starting a 16-3 run to build a 57-38 advantage with 10:09 left. After Lipscomb again pulled to within 10, UWM scored nine straight to rebuild a 19-point advantage at 68-49.

"We had those two explosive spurts," coach Bo Ryan said. "We weren't getting them initially because they were playing hard and getting after us."

Dan Weisse added 13 points and seven assists, while James Wright pitched in with seven points and 12 rebounds. The Panthers outrebounded Lipscomb 39-21, including 18-6 on the offensive glass.

For the true freshman Wright, the 12 rebounds are an early career high. The game also provided Wright a chance to bounce back after foul trouble limited his time in the Panthers' loss at Iowa.

"I kind of used that game as a step into the college game," Wright said. "It was nice to get another opportunity to go out there and play."

The Panthers' defense limited Lipscomb to 40 percent shooting from the field, and forced 20 turnovers. The Bisons had only seven assists.

"We were very active defensively," Ryan said. "Seven assists to 20 turnovers - that's a good defensive game."

Lipscomb led only once in the game, grabbing a 6-4 advantage three minutes in. UWM led by as many as 11 points in the first half, and carried an eight-point lead into the locker room.

## Game 3 - UWM 78, Fla. Atlantic 60

Fri. Nov. 24 @ Miami, Fla.

**MIAMI** - There will be no need for a recount in this Florida contest.

The UWM men's basketball team overcame sluggish early-game shooting to gradually pull away from Florida Atlantic, 78-60, Friday afternoon at the Golden Panther Thanksgiving Shootout.

Clay Tucker scored 26 points to lead the Panthers (2-1), while Chad Angeli added 13 and Kalombo Kadima scored 10.

UWM used a 12-0 first half run to build a 37-24 halftime advantage, then pushed their lead to 20 at 50-30 with 15:45 to play. The Owls (0-3) closed to within 13 at 56-43, but UWM used a 14-2 run to build a 70-45 lead with under five minutes to play, putting the game away. The run was highlighted by an alley-oop pass off the backboard from Tucker to a flying James Wright, who slammed the ball home.

But in the end, especially with the slow start offensively, the Panthers did the most damage on the defensive end, forcing 16 Owl turnovers and limiting Florida Atlantic to 43 percent shooting.

"You just look at the consistency with which we played defensively," coach Bo Ryan said. "They hit some shots at the end, but the game was out of reach."

The Panthers trailed 9-5 early, then pulled even at 11-11 despite 5-for-20 shooting from the field, and 0-for-6 shooting from the three-point line.

"Our outside shooting was not very good," Ryan said. "They were helping on anybody in the post, so on our kickouts we were getting some pretty good looks. We just didn't put them down."

## Game 4 - Canisius 82, UWM 80

Sat. Nov. 25 @ Miami, Fla.

**MIAMI** - Tory Jefferson scored on a tip-in with 7.2 seconds to play, leading Canisius College to an 82-80 victory over UWM Saturday afternoon at the Golden Panther Thanksgiving Shootout.

The Panthers had a chance to win or tie in the closing seconds, but a three-point try from the left wing by Dan Weisse rimmed off. Chad Angeli appeared to be fouled on an open tip-in try of the miss, but no whistle sounded as time expired.

Sophomore Clay Tucker scored 25 points to lead the Panthers (2-2), while senior Chad Angeli added 20.

UWM could not overcome 56 percent shooting by the Golden Griffins (2-0).

Canisius grabbed a 79-78 lead with 2:23 to play on two Darren Fenn free throws, and Fenn hit 1-of-2 tries nearly a minute later to push the advantage to 80-78. UWM tied the game on an Angeli basket and foul with 1:14 to play, but he missed the free throw and James Wright missed on a follow-up try that would have given the Panthers the lead. The Golden Griffins then held the ball for nearly the final minute of the game, getting a new shot clock on an offensive rebound. Jefferson's tip came off a miss by Clive Bentick.

Canisius grabbed a 77-76 advantage on a Hodari Mallory three-point basket with 3:57 to play. But, a Kalombo Kadima tip-in gave UWM the lead back, 78-77.

UWM led by as many as nine in the second half, claiming a 65-56 lead on a Tucker jump shot off the glass with just under 13 minutes to play.

The Golden Griffins shot 64 percent in the first half, yet the Panthers were able to build a nine-point first half edge, and UWM led 47-41 at the half.

**Game 5 - UWM 73, Beth-Cookman 63**  
**Mon. Nov. 27 @ Daytona, Fla.**

**DAYTONA BEACH, Fla.** - Clay Tucker scored 23 points to lead UWM to a 73-63 win over Bethune-Cookman Monday night.

The Panthers (3-2) led by eight points at halftime and by as many as 12 points in the second half.

Dan Weisse scored 14, and did not commit a turnover in 34 minutes of action. As a team, UWM committed just 10 turnovers against the full-court pressure of the Wildcats.

"I was pleased, because a lot of the turnovers we did make came when we were trying to make the extra pass inside," coach Bo Ryan said. "I thought we passed the ball and caught the ball extremely well, a lot better than a lot of teams do coming in here."

UWM led by just five with two minutes to play, but the Panthers scored the next four points to put the game away. James Wright scored on a one-handed follow up dunk with 1:08 left to give the Panthers a 67-58 edge.

"I thought we handled things extremely well tonight," Ryan said. "I thought we overcame some weaknesses from Saturday. In order to beat good teams, you're going to have to take care of the details. We took care of the details tonight."

Chad Angeli pitched in with 10 points despite battling foul trouble all evening. UWM shot 59 percent from the field in the second half after shooting just 33 percent in the first half.

The UWM men's basketball team hung tough down the stretch, outscoring Valparaiso 18-11 in the final 10 minutes of the game to claim a 61-59 victory. Dan Weisse and Jason Frederick scored 12 points apiece to lead a balanced UWM (4-2) attack.

The Crusaders (3-2) led 48-43 with 10:15 to play before the Panthers made their run down the stretch. The Panthers took the lead for good on a Jason Frederick three with 8:15 remaining, then hung on with defense and rebounding. The play down the stretch was in contrast to the struggles UWM experienced Saturday in an 82-80 loss to Canisius, when the Panthers lost a nine-point second half lead.

"Our players needed that," coach Bo Ryan said. "To get one like that against a good team like that, it's a real boost. If we don't have the Canisius game, and learn from it, we probably don't get this one."

Valpo pulled to within two at 58-56 with 1:50 to play, but the Panthers went back up four on a Kalombo Kadima layup off a great feed from Clay Tucker with 25 seconds remaining. On the ensuing Valpo possession, James Wright drew a charge on a Lubos Barton drive to seal the win.

"We take a charge there at the end, by a freshman, because a senior (Chad Angeli) took a charge earlier in the half and he was watching that," Ryan said. "Against Canisius, that guy got all the way to the basket for a three-point play."

For the second consecutive game, Weisse did not commit a turnover. UWM's defense forced 21 turnovers, while limiting the Crusaders to 38 percent shooting in the second half.

Ronnie Jones and Tucker added eight points apiece for the Panthers, who won before a crowd of 3,123.

**Game 7 - UWM 72, Chicago St. 55**

**CHICAGO** - Clay Tucker scored 25 points to lead three Panthers in double figures as UWM downed Chicago State 72-55 Monday night.

The Panthers built a 13-point halftime advantage and led by as many as 23 in the second half.

Chad Angeli scored 15 points, James Wright added a career-high 12, and Jason Frederick added 9 off-the-bench to lead the Panthers (5-2). UWM won for the third straight time, its first three-game winning streak since 1999. At 5-2, the Panthers are off to their best start since the 1992-93 season.

"We took care of the ball," Panther coach Bo Ryan said as UWM committed just nine turnovers. "We took them out of what they wanted to do offensively. There were a number of possessions where they didn't get it inside like they wanted to do. We disrupted them."

The Panthers wound up outscoring the Cougars (1-4) 30-11 over the final 11:27 of the half.

With 18 seconds left, a Frederick three-pointer forced the overtime. Colorado then scored the first seven points of the extra period, building a 71-64 advantage with 2:24 remaining. The Panthers closed to within 73-71 on another Frederick three. Then, after Jamahl Mosley hit one of two free throws with six seconds remaining, Clay Tucker's three-point shot rimmed off at the buzzer.

"They're as well-coached and as well-disciplined a team as we'll face all year," Colorado head coach Ricardo Patton said. "We were very fortunate to win the game."

The Panthers (7-5) led by 11 points at halftime and increased the lead to 43-28 on a Mike Sowder three with 17:26 remaining. But, Colorado countered by scoring 21 of the next 26 points to grab a 51-49 lead at the 7:46 mark. The lead grew as large as six at 62-56 with 3:43 remaining before the Panthers bounced back to force overtime.

"That game was ours," UWM coach Bo Ryan said. "We never care what the name on the jersey is. We feel we can play with anyone on any night. I like the way our guys scrapped tonight."

**MILWAUKEE, Wis.** - Butler outscored the UWM men's basketball team 19-10 over the final 7:39 of the game to claim a 60-51 come-from-behind victory at the Klotsche Center Saturday night.

The Panthers (10-8, 2-3 MCC) led 41-40 following a Clay Tucker three-point basket, but Butler ran off 13 of the next 18 points to build a 53-45 lead with 1:00 remaining. From there, the Bulldogs made five-of-six free throws to clinch the victory.

UWM led by as many as 10 in the second half, building a 28-18 advantage following a Dan Weisse basket and foul with 18:44 to play. But Butler slowly moved back into the game, scoring nine straight to pull within 28-27. Then, after UWM rebuilt a 35-29 advantage, the Bulldogs used an 11-3 run to claim a 40-38 advantage.

"I thought it was just a great effort by our guys," Panther coach Bo Ryan said. "You've got to give Butler credit because they found that crease when they needed to."

Sophomore Justin Lettenberger made his first career start for the Panthers in place of the injured James Wright. In a career-high 29 minutes, the Manitowoc native scored 11 points and grabbed six rebounds.

"He just wants to play, and he does it everyday," Ryan said. "He just plays hard."

UWM held Butler scoreless for the first five minutes of the game, and after the Bulldogs came back to claim an 12-6 advantage, the Panthers scored nine straight for a 17-12 lead, and UWM led 25-18 at the half.

**DETROIT, Mich.** - Rashad Phillips made a three-point basket from beyond the top of the key with 4.6 seconds remaining to lead Detroit to a come-from-behind 54-51 win Thursday night.

The Panthers had a chance to tie the game in the final seconds, but a Ronnie Jones three-point try rimmed off at the buzzer.
