

## 2008-09 WYOMING COWBOY WRESTLING

**'Pokes Successful at NCAA Tournament, LeBlanc an All-American:** Wrestling in front of an average of 16,000 fans per session did not phase four Cowboys at the NCAA Championships, March 19-21 in St. Louis, Mo.

Each UW qualifier won at least one match and redshirt freshman Joe LeBlanc went 5-2, finished in fifth place and was named an All-American.

LeBlanc became the first All-American in 13 years for UW's wrestling program and the 24th in school history. His only two losses came at the hands of top-3 finishers.

He is UW's first freshman All-American in program history, as well as the 'Pokes first All-American in wrestling since 1996 when Brent Voorhees (seventh), Brandon Alderman (sixth) and Reese Andy (second) all earned the distinction. The five wins by LeBlanc at the NCAA Tournament was also the highest number for the Cowboy program since '96 when Voorhees was 5-2.

During his tournament run, LeBlanc beat four seeded (top-12) opponents, one by major decision and one by fall, in addition to winning two bouts against opponents he had lost to earlier this season.

At 174 pounds redshirt freshman Shane Onufer went 2-2 before being knocked out of the back draw, while fellow redshirt freshman Michael Martinez (125) and junior Cory VomBaur (133) each went 1-2 in their matches.

Martinez won his opening match over No. 17 ranked Marcus Orozco of UC Davis, who had beaten him earlier this year. VomBaur got his first NCAA tournament victory in his three years at the event, while Onufer beat tough opponents from Virginia Tech and Penn.

As a team, the Cowboys tied for 32nd place of 76 teams with 18.5 points.

The three-day event took place at the Scotttrade Center.

**West Regional/WWC Tourney Success:** A runner-up team finish, four individual champions and automatic NCAA qualifiers, as well as nine of 10 wrestlers placing in the top-3 of their weight class, equalled a successful West Regional/WWC Tournament on Saturday, March 7 for the Cowboys.

The 'Pokes closed the gap on the No. 21-ranked Northern Iowa Panthers, losing the team title by a mere one and a half points. UNI has now won 24 straight West Regional titles, but the Cowboys gave notice with their talented young team that they will be in contention for that conference title from this point forward.

Michael Martinez (125), Cory VomBaur (133), Shane Onufer (174) and Joe LeBlanc (184) all won their weight classes and earned automatic slots in the NCAA Championship brackets. Martinez and Onufer were both 3-0, while VomBaur and LeBlanc were 2-0 thanks to first round byes.

Alex Rieder placed second at 165 pounds, while Cole Dallaserra (141), Eric Coxbill (157), Alfonso Hernandez (197) and Jacob Scharbrough (Hwt.) all placed third.

Wyoming head coach Mark Branch was named the WWC Coach of the Year.

**Regular Season Dual Champions:** With their dual win over UNCo. on Feb. 25, the Cowboys remained undefeated in the WWC and claimed a share of the league regular season dual championship along with Northern Iowa.

UW had five league victories, while UNI had only four wins within the conference and did not wrestle Wyoming and Utah Valley.

It is the first time in the three-year history of the league that UW has won a regular season title.

**LeBlanc, Onufer and Martinez Top-10 on UW's Single Season Win List; Onufer 10th on Pin List:** With five wins at the NCAA Tournament, redshirt freshman Joe LeBlanc finishes the season with a record of 45-8 and is tied for third place on UW's All-Time Single Season Victories list with Wes Gasner, who had 45 wins during the 1983-84 season.

Ron Whitman owns the UW record, with 47 wins in 1984-85. Mike McNaney (1985-86) is second with 46 wins.

Fellow redshirt freshman Shane Onufer finished only one win behind LeBlanc, with a season record of 44-11. That mark ties him for fifth on the All-Time list with Wes Gasner (1982-83).

A third redshirt freshman, Michael Martinez, snuck onto the top-10 list by finishing 38-11, which ties him for ninth all-time at UW with Reese Andy (1995-96).

Onufer also finished with 14 pins this season, putting himself 10th on the UW All-Time Single Season Pins list.

There are three former UW wrestlers tied for ninth place (Andy Bell, Bill Hodges and Paul Reed) who have 15 pins in one season.

Bill Lingernfelser (1983-84) is the Cowboy record-holder for Single Season Pins with 21.

**WYOMING HEAD COACH MARK BRANCH**

On July 14, 2008, Mark Branch was selected as the 14th head coach in the rich history of the University of Wyoming Wrestling program.

Branch comes to Wyoming from Oklahoma State University where he was the Associate Head Wrestling Coach for six years, as well as a four-time NCAA finalist as a student-athlete. He was a part of five NCAA team championships as a coach and student-athlete at OSU.

As a student-athlete at OSU, Branch was a four-time NCAA All-American (1994-97), four-time NCAA National Finalist (1994-97) and two-time NCAA National Champion at 167 pounds (1994 and '97).

As a member of the OSU coaching staff, Branch was named the National Wrestling Coaches' Association (NWCA) Assistant Coach of the Year in 2004. He helped coach OSU to seven Big XII Championships, four NCAA Championships and three Dual Team Championships. He coached 57 All-Americans and 16 NCAA Champions.

**40 Wins is the New 30...and Counting:** With plenty of mat time and experience this season, several members of the Cowboy team have stock-piled some gaudy win totals. In fact, two members of the Wyoming squad have over 40 wins, one other has breached the 30-win plateau and eight others have broken the 20-win barrier.

Leading the team, Joe LeBlanc is 45-8 at 184 pounds, while Shane Onufer is 44-11 at 174 pounds and Michael Martinez is 38-11 at 125 pounds.

With a minimum of 20 wins are Cory VomBaur (28-14), Alex Rieder (27-16), Jacob Scharbrough (28-16), Cole Dallaserra (24-13), Chase Smith (22-23), Tyler Davis (21-16), Alfonso Hernandez (23-19) and Eric Coxbill (23-14).

It is the second straight year that both Coxbill and VomBaur have had 20-win seasons. Last season Coxbill was 26-12, while VomBaur was 20-17.

#### **Final NCAA Coaches Rankings/RPI Released, Qualifier Allocations Awarded as a Result:**

On Thurs., Feb. 26, the NCAA released the last of three coaches' panel rankings and RPI for the 2008-09 wrestling season. Based on those lists, as well as winning percentage, the NCAA announced the qualifier allocations for the 2009 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships.

The West Regional was awarded 13 automatic qualifiers, in contrast to the 20 qualifiers the event was given last year under the old system. The tournament champion in each weight class qualified, as well as the second-place finisher at 149, 184 and 197.

Five Cowboy wrestlers were mentioned on those NCAA lists, although a mention did not equal an automatic bid: Michael Martinez at 125 pounds (No. 27/30) and Joe LeBlanc at 184 (No. 10/7) were mentioned in both the rankings and RPI, while Cory VomBaur at 133 (No. 26) and Jacob Scharbrough at heavyweight (No. 31) made the RPI list. Shane Onufer at 174 pounds (No. 19) was in the coaches' rankings.

Based on those numbers, LeBlanc earned the West Regional a spot at 184 pounds, while Martinez was right on the outside of the bubble looking in at 125 pounds.

Each qualifying tournament was awarded spots per weight class based on current year data. Each wrestler was measured on the following: Division I winning percentage; rating percentage index (RPI); and coaches ranking. A threshold of a 0.725 winning percentage, top 28 in the RPI and top 28 in the coaches ranking was established to allocate 278 of the 330 championships field positions.

For each wrestler that reached the threshold in at least two of the three categories, his qualifying tournament was awarded a qualifying spot in that weight

class. Each qualifying tournament was awarded a minimum of one wrestler per weight class, for the tournament champion, even if they did not have any wrestlers reach at least two of the three thresholds.

The NCAA Division I Wrestling Committee then met in-person to select the remaining 52 at-large qualifiers on March 11. The WWC was given one additional wild-card bid, Northern Colorado's Tony Mustari at 125 pounds. All weight classes consisted of 33 wrestlers.

The at-large selections were made based on the following criteria: head-to-head competition; qualifying event placement; quality wins; results against common opponents; winning percentage; RPI; coaches ranking and the number of matches contested at that weight class.

**WWC Wrestlers of the Week:** Three Cowboy wrestlers have been honored this season by the Western Wrestling Conference as Wrestler of the Week for their efforts. Most recently was Michael Martinez, who this past week earned the honor for the second time in 2008-09.

**Cowboys In Weekly Rankings:** There are several national organizations that send out weekly collegiate wrestling rankings, most notably the InterMat/NWCA/USA Today poll. One junior and three Cowboy redshirt freshmen are currently ranked in one poll or another.

Joe LeBlanc (184 lbs) is listed in the InterMat individual rankings at No. 8.

Shane Onufer (174 lbs) is ranked No. 17 by InterMat.

Michael Martinez is No. 23 at 125 pounds by WrestlingReport.com, while Cory VomBaur (133 lbs) is ranked No. 30 by that same organization.

**National Media Coverage:** The Cowboys have found themselves as a bit of a media favorite within the national wrestling community this season, due to their improved performance and the reputation of head coach Mark Branch.

Wyoming has been featured on *FloWrestling.com*, in *W.I.N.* magazine and in the *Denver Post* to name just a few. Prior to the prestigious National Duals, Branch was a featured guest on *Wrestling 411 Radio's* tournament preview show, hosted by Jason Bryant and Kyle Klingman.
