Cowgirls Host UNLV and San Diego State During The Upcoming Weekend: The Wyoming Cowgirl Volleyball team will host UNLV and San Diego State over the upcoming weekend. The Cowgirls will face San Diego St. on Friday night at 7:00 p.m., and UNLV at 7:00 p.m. on Saturday night,.

About Last Week: The Cowgirls went 1-1 over the weekend, which included their first conference victory over Air Force. Despite a well fought match, the Cowgirls were defeated by the New Mexico Lobos on Friday night in Albuquerque. It was a game of runs to begin the match. The Cowgirls took the early 4-0 lead, and seemed to gain some momentum. New Mexico had an answer with five points of their own. Up 11-7, the Cowgirls would not score another point as the Lobos would run off eight straight unanswered to take the game 15-11. Game two once again saw the Cowgirls take an early 6-2 lead. But they were unable to hold, with New Mexico taking advantage of several mistakes and a 9-7 advantage. A nine all tie was all they would be able to manage falling 12-15 in the game and 0-2 in the match. Despite scoring points early in game three, Wyoming fell behind 5-8. But great serving by Barbie Bragg got the Cowgirls back into the game with eight unanswered, and a 10-8 advantage. Unfortunately, a 7-1 run would put the match away for the Lobos. They would take the game 15-11 and the match 3-0. Middle blocker Ericka Sansoni led the way for New Mexico with ten kills and 18 digs. On the night, Wyoming finished the night off hitting only .105 (42-27-143) and with eight total team blocks. Senior Melody Friehauf notched 13 kills, three block solos and four block assists. In the second match of the weekend, the Cowgirls earned their first Mountain West Conference victory of the 2000 season against the Air Force Academy Falcons on Saturday night. It turned out to be a well fought battle throughout the match as each team was seeking their first conference win of the season. The Falcons gained the early advantage in the game taking a 9-3 lead, and it looked like they would run away with it. The Cowgirls fought back closing the gap to 9-7, but Air Force would widen the gap to 11-7. But a driven Cowgirl squad fought back to take the game 16-14. They seemed to have the momentum going into the second game taking the early 3-1 lead, but that was the only lead they would hold. Air Force would tie the match at one a piece with a 15-10 victory. A spark must have been lite under the team in game three with a dominating 15-0 win. As a team, the Cowgirls hit .417 for the game, along with Rachel Lau's four kills and .800 hitting percentage. They would close out the match with a 15-8 victory in game four to win their first conference match. Freshman outside hitter Michele Rauter led the way for the Cowgirls with 16 kills, 15 digs and a .300 hitting percentage. Melissa Robinett, in only her second start of her career, had a career night with nine kills and 18 digs.

About San Diego State: The Cowgirls will play the San Diego State Aztecs on Friday night in Laramie. They enter the match with a 9-9 overall record and 3-2 in the conference. The Aztecs are led by Monet Solberg, who is averaging 3.29 kills and 2.34 digs per game. This is the 19th meeting between the two schools, San Diego State leads 16-2. The Aztecs are coached by Mark Warner, who is in his sixth year.

About UNLV: Wyoming will play the UNLV Rebels to finish out the weekend on Saturday night. They are currently 1-13 overall and 1-4 in the conference coming into the weekend. This is the ninth meeting between the two schools, Wyoming leads 6-2. UNLV is coached by Deitre Collins, who is in her fifth season.

Judge Enters Fifth Season As Wyoming Head Volleyball Coach: Susan Judge enters her fifth year as the head coach of the Cowgirls. During her time at Wyoming, she has coached four All-Conference players in her time at Wyoming, including Jami Laya and Melody Frieauf. Judge came to Wyoming from Marshall University where she guided her team to a 1995 NCAA Tournament berth in only her second season as a head coach. She was originally hired at Marshall by current Wyoming Athletics Director Lee Moon.

A 1991 graduate of Mississippi State University, Judge led Marshall to a 25-11 record in '95, a Southern Conference Championship and the school's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament. She earned Southern Conference Coach of the Year honors in '95.

Friehauf Continues Climb into the Wyoming Record Book: Senior middle blocker Melody Friehauf continues her move into the Wyoming Top 10 in blocks and kills during the 2000 season. With 144 total blocks last year, Friehauf jumped from tenth place to second on the all-time career blocks list in 1999. She surpassed Katie Donahue for second place on the list. She currently has 97 on the season, and 544 in her career. She is also moved into the top ten in kills at number four with 1,175 kills. Friehauf, from Windsor, Colo., is a three-year starter and two-time All-Conference Player. She was named the MWC Player of the Week twice, and earned All-Tournament honors three times.

#2 Melody Friehauf: A returning three-year starter for the Cowgirls this season...has played in all 20 matches for the Cowgirls, including two starts...currently leads the team in hitting percentage at .295 and blocks with 1.35 per game...she is also second in kills with 2.76 per game...had a season high 18 kills against Utah State (9/14/0)...earned All-Tournament honors at the Panther Invitational, the Cowgirl Classic and Golden Dome Invitational.

#3 Katy Brown: A total team player, who has blended well with her teammates...has played in 18 matches this season, including 16 starts...has 555 assists (9.25 aspg) on the season, plus 23 service aces...is also averaging 1.68 digs per game...had a career high 61 assists against Wisconsin-Green Bay (9/16/00).

#4 Michele Rauter: A real power hitter, who adds depth to the outside hitter position...has 18 starts in 20 matches for the Cowgirls...her first collegiate start game against Oregon (9/1/00)...is currently third on the team in kills averaging 2.60 per game, plus has 22 service aces on the season...had a season and career high 19 kills Wisconsin-Green Bay (9/16/00)...plus a career high 17 digs against Austin Peay (9/9/00).

#5 Jamie Burke: One of three returning starters to this year's team...as a senior, brings the most experience to the outside hitter position...has played in 18 matches for the Cowgirls this season, including 17 starts...leads the team in kills and digs with 3.31 kpg and 2.73 dpg...finished the UT-Arlington match with 20 kills, 14 digs and a .326 hitting percentage.

#6 Melissa Robinett: A strong athlete, who can play at several positions on the floor...should be able to compete and contribute in her first season, but will need to adjust to the tempo of the sets run...has excellent ball handling skills for a taller player...has seen action in nine matches, including her first collegiate start against New Mexico...is averaging 1.88 digs per game, and has 14 kills on the season...had a career high nine kills and 18 digs against Air Force (10/7/00).

#7 Shannon Patrick: A good athlete with excellent skills...a walk-on to this year's squad...adds depth to the outside hitter position...has played in 16 of 20 matches this season, including ten starts...is averaging 1.02 digs per contest...had a career high 8 digs against Wisc.-G.B. and Loyola-Chicago.

#8 Barbie Bragg: One of three seniors on the 2000 Cowgirl squad...earned a scholarship this season after walking on in 1999...has played in all 20 matches and 67 games this season, including 15 starts...is averaging 2.06 kills and .63 blocks per game...had 11 kills and hit .207 against Mississippi (9/2/00)...earned All-Tournament honors at the Cowgirl Classic...also had a season and career high 16 kills against Xavier (9/15/00).

#9 Mandi Kerr: A walk-on to this year's team...adds good height and depth to the middle blocker position...will likely redshirt this season.

#10 Stefanie Snyder: An excellent player, who comes to Wyoming after transferring from the University of North Dakota...is second on the team in assists with 5.32 per game...has played in 14 matches this season, along with starts in three...is also adding one dig per game...had a season and career high 43 assists against Oregon (9/1/00).

#11 Megan Shuster: A walk-on to this year's squad...adds depth to the Cowgirl roster...a three-year letterwinner at Laramie High School...has played in nine matches including two starts this year...has four service aces and 12 digs...had a career high two kills against Xavier (9/15/00).

#12 Katie Jarman: A player who could make an immediate impact in her first season...provides more depth on the defensive side of the ball...has started in ten of 16 matches this season, and played in 49 games...her first collegiate start came against Oregon...has 59 digs, to average 1.20 per game...had a career high 11 digs against Austin Peay (9-9-00).

#14 Lori Sanford: Enrolled at the University of Wyoming in January of 2000...an excellent athlete, who should contribute to the program...has played in eight matches, including one start, this season...has nine kills and seven blocks on the year.

#15 Jansen Siplon: Enters her first season of competition with the Cowgirls after redshirting last year...an excellent athlete with good size and great potential...has played in 11 matches this season, including her first start against Loyola-Chicago (9-17-00)...has eight kills and 15 digs on the season.

#16 Rachel Lau: A solid starter from a year ago for the Cowgirls...an excellent athlete, look for her to be more aggressive this season...has made tremendous improvements, both offensively and defensively, over the past two seasons...has started in every match for the Cowgirls...is second on the team in blocks with one per game and fifth in kills, averaging 1.96...is also adding 1.19 digs per game...had a season high 14 kills and ten digs against Wisc.-Green Bay (9/16/00).
