2005 CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

49th Annual Baseball National Championship

May 27-June 3, 2005

Lewis-Clark State College - Lewiston, Idaho

Mike Mlotkowski allowed only four hits in eight innings and Colby Overstreet drove in three runs to help the Oklahoma City University baseball team to its first national title with an 8-1 win over Embry-Riddle University in the championship game of the 49th annual Avista NAIA World Series at Harris Field.

The Stars out-hit Embry-Riddle 16-4 in the contest and used Mlotkowski's second strong outing of the tournament to become the 25th program to capture an NAIA baseball national championship.

The victory also snapped a three-game losing streak in title games for the Stars (67-12), who were making their fourth straight championship game appearance. Embry-Riddle (53-10) was making its first title game appearance.

The Stars made it 4-1 in the sixth as Embry-Riddle struggled to find fresh arms. Overstreet started the rally with a one-out single and went to third on a single by Derek Snell. After Snell stole second, Alexi Ojeda was intentionally walked to load the bases. With two outs, pinch-hitter Antwan Capla singled to right to drive in two runs.

Overstreet also had a hand in the four-run seventh. After a single and an error, Overstreet drove in the first run with a single. Snell, Bobby Spain and Ryan Walker followed with consecutive RBI singles to make it 8-1.

Starter Ryan Patrick allowed two runs and four hits in the first four innings for the Eagles and took the loss. Relievers David Timm and Chris Langois had already pitched in two games the past week and combined to allow 12 hits over the final five innings.
