2005 MEN'S CHAMPIONSHIP RECAP

54th Annual Men's

May 16-20, 2005 - Mobile Tennis Center - Mobile, Alabama

Azusa Pacific University (Calif.) captured the school's first men's tennis national championship following a 5-3 match victory against College of Santa Fe (N.M.) in the championship match. The runner-up from 2004, APU took two of the three doubles matches for the early lead. Sam Fletcher and Boris Bakalov both posted victories at the #1 and #2 singles, paving the way for Gordon Hong to seal the victory at the #5 singles.

The Cougars were playing in their third consecutive championship match, while Santa Fe was making its first appearance in the title match. Fletcher received the Ward-Ballinger Award for the tournament's outstanding player. It was the third consecutive honor for Fletcher. APU head coach Mark Bohren was named the Coach of the Year.
