#7 WALSH CAPTURES FIRST NATIONAL TITLE WITH WIN OVER #4 CONCORDIA

POINT LOOKOUT, Mo. – Seventh-seeded Walsh University (Ohio) defeated #4 Concordia University (Neb.), 81-70, in the championship game of the 14th Annual NAIA Division II Men's Basketball National Championship on Tues., March 15. The 32-team, single-elimination tournament was held at Keeter Gymnasium on the campus of College of the Ozarks (Mo.).

This is Walsh's first national title in its first championship game appearance.

Concordia's Jon Ziegler and Jason Jisa played well to stake the Bulldogs to an early lead, scoring 13 and 10 points, respectively, in the first half. Concordia led by as many as five points, before the Cavaliers started to fight their way back behind the play of Robert Whaley (10 points, five rebounds) and Randy Sistrunk (nine points). The Cavaliers led 32-28 at the break after shooting 57 percent from the field.

The Cavaliers continued their surge in the second half, using a 20-2 run, to go up 50-32. The Bulldogs were never able to pull closer than nine down the stretch, as the Cavaliers shot 70 percent from the field in the second half.

Tournament Most Valuable Player Robert Whaley led Walsh with 25 points, nine rebounds, four steals, and two blocked shots. The 6-foot-10 Whaley was also named the Rawlings National Player of the Year earlier in the day. He averaged 22.8 points and 8.4 rebounds over the tournament's five games. Randy Sistrunk added 18 points, Jason Hicks chipped in with 16 points and five rebounds, and Corey Jones finished with 13 points and three rebounds. Walsh shot 63 percent from the field and converted 8-of-14 three-point attempts on the night. This was their fifth national tournament appearance. They finish the season with a 27-8 record.

Ziegler led the way for the Bulldogs with 25 points and four assists. Jisa added 20 points and Scott Beck chipped in with 10 points and game-highs in rebounds (14) and assists (5). This was their eighth national tournament appearance. They finish the season with a 32-6 record.

It was the first time either of these schools had advanced to the national title game and it was the first time a #4 seed had met a #7 seed for the championship. This marks just the second time a #7 seed has won the tournament. Northwestern (Iowa) defeated MidAmerica Nazarene (Kan.), 82-78, in 2001.

Walsh, the American Midwest Conference South Division champions, worked its way through the tournament with victories over unseeded Tabor (Kan.), 68-62, #10 Embry-Riddle (Fla.), 73-71, #2 Northwestern (Iowa), 68-61, and defending champion #6 Oregon Tech, 77-70.

Concordia, the Great Plains Athletic Conference tournament champions, worked its way through the national tournament with wins over unseeded Trinity Christian (Ill.), 74-69, #13 Flagler (Fla.), 70-63, #5 Cornerstone (Mich.), 71-68, and #16 Cedarville (Ohio), 62-56.
