GENERAL INFORMATION

II. HISTORY

A. NAIA

The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association currently administering programs of intercollegiate athletics for nearly 300 fully accredited colleges and universities of moderate enrollment. The fundamental tenet of the NAIA is that intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the total educational program of the institution. This belief is strongly reflected in the governing documents, activities and organizational structure of the Association.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball (NAIB), the Association expanded to include other programs in 1952. The NAIA became the first intercollegiate sports governing body to provide championship opportunities for both men and women when the women's program was established on August 1, 1980.

B. Men's Basketball Program

The purpose of this manual is to provide a uniform operating code for the conduct and administration of the NAIA Men's Basketball National Championship, specifically the affiliated conference and national championships. These policies and procedures are written to be comprehensive enough to cover the varied conditions that exist throughout the affiliated conferences.

Affiliated conference basketball tournaments provide a significant percentage of the financial base for the conduct of affiliated conference programs throughout the NAIA. Efficient administration and promotion should be a major objective of each affiliated conference. The NAIA Council of Athletics Administrators requests your cooperation in becoming thoroughly familiar with this manual and in cooperating with the affiliated conference committees in the effective application of all procedures.

C. Past Champions

The NAIA Men's Basketball National Championship history is marked with great tradition, great teams, great players, and great coaches. It remains the world's oldest and largest intercollegiate championship basketball tournament.

The National Association of Basketball Coaches – NAIA Division (NABC-NAIA) is an organization of collegiate basketball coaches whose institutions are in good standing with the NAIA. The NABC-NAIA meets annually at the National Association of Basketball Coaches Convention.

The NABC-NAIA elects officers who serve a one-year term and provide the leadership for the Association. The NABC-NAIA studies and makes recommendations on all issues affecting the organization and administration of the NAIA men's basketball program. Important standing committees of the NABC-NAIA include the tournament committees, which are directly responsible for the administration of the national tournaments.

IV. BASKETBALL AWARDS

A. Player of the Week

1. Conference Player of the Week

All NAIA member institutions are encouraged to nominate candidates for Conference Player of the Week for all sports in which they declare for NAIA post season.

2. National Player of the Week

All NAIA member institutions are permitted to nominate candidates for National Player of the Week for all sports in which they are declare for NAIA post season. National Players of the Week are selected from Conference Players of the Week for each of the affiliated conferences. Honorees are released in conjunction with national ratings on Wednesdays.

B. All-America

All-America awards are annually bestowed on the most outstanding athletes in the NAIA. Criteria for the awards and the procedures for selection and implementation are forwarded by each coaches association and approved by the Council of Affiliated Conferences and Independents. Please note some sports recognize All-America selections by order of finish, while others require submission of materials at the conference/independent level or regional level.

The NAIA strongly recommends All-America nomination material be sent via overnight, registered or certified mail. The NAIA will not be responsible for nominations that are lost in the mail when not sent by one of the above listed methods. The NAIA is not responsible for material faxed to the national office.

C. Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete Award

The NAIA-Men's Basketball Coaches Association selects the Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete honorees each year based on criteria and standards established by the NAIA Council of Affiliated Conferences and Independents. Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete awards are given annually to the most outstanding student-athletes in the NAIA. The program recognizes excellence in the classroom while competing in a sport.

The procedure involves completion and delivery of an official nomination form. All nominations must be **typed** on the appropriate form located in this handbook.

The NAIA Department of Sports Information will release the NAIA Men's Basketball Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete selections on March 25 for both Division I and Division II men's basketball.

The following criteria for Scholar-Athletes are applied by all coaches associations:

- There shall be no minimum or maximum number selected.
- Nominee **must** be a junior or above in academic standing.
- Nominee **must** have a cumulative 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- Nominee **must** have been in attendance at nominating institution for one full academic year.
- Nominee **must** appear on eligibility certificate for sport in which nominated.
- Nominee **must** be nominated for the award.
- Nomination form **must** be received prior to the deadline.
- Nomination packet **must** be complete at the time of receipt, including appropriate signatures.
- Faxed nominations will not be accepted.

The deadline for **receipt** of Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete materials is February 19 for both Division I and Division II. A checklist (see Appendix F) has been established to ensure all materials are received.

The NAIA strongly recommends Daktronics-NAIA Scholar-Athlete nomination forms be sent via overnight mail, registered or certified mail. The NAIA will **NOT** be responsible for nomination packets that are lost in the mail when not sent by one of the above listed methods.

D. Scholar Team Award

In recognition of academic achievement, the NAIA names a Scholar Team for all sports in which Scholar-Athletes are recognized. Based on a 3.0 season GPA on a 4.0 scale, all members of the team who appear on the eligibility certificate will be included in the GPA compilation. Please refer to Appendix H and I for nomination procedures.

All nominations are to be submitted by mail to the NAIA National Office, 1200 Grand Blvd, Kansas City, Missouri, 64106. They **MUST** be received no later than June 30, 2008. **No faxed forms or late nominations will be accepted. The NAIA strongly recommends Team Scholar nominations be sent via overnight mail, registered or certified mail.** The NAIA will **NOT** be responsible for nomination packets that are lost in the mail when not sent by one of the above listed methods.

E. National Player of the Year

A national player of the year is selected for both Division I and II. Selection is made by the All-America selection committee of each division from players nominated to the All-America team by a conference or independent grouping.

The NAIA Department of Sports Information will release the players of the year with the All-America listings on March 25 (Division I) and March 18 (Division II), respectively.

F. Coach of the Year

The NABC-NAIA names a national coach of the year in each division. The selections are made by each division's All-America Committee. Candidates for national coach of the year include affiliated conference/independent coaches of the year and all other coaches of teams that qualify for one of the national championships. The NABC-NAIA National Coach-of-the-Year alternates each year between the Division I and Division II honorees (or designate). The 2008 NABC-NAIA National Coach-of-the-Year will be a Division I NAIA coach.

G. National Championship Awards

The NAIA maintains a standardized awards program for the national championship.

National championship awards are provided to the official parties of the top four teams. In addition, awards are presented to all-tournament team members (ten total), a hustle award recipient, a most valuable player award recipient, and a team that wins an award for team sportsmanship. All participants receive NAIA certificates of participation.

H. Ordering Awards

Conference tournament awards are to be ordered by the conference commissioner or conference basketball chair and are the financial responsibility of the conference.

V. NAIA – NATIONAL AWARDS

A. Buffalo Funds Five Star Champions of Character Team Award

The *Champions of Character* Team Award sponsored by Buffalo Funds is an annual award given at the end of each sport season. Each sport will award *the Champions of Character* Team award to one team on a yearly basis and **all** NAIA teams are eligible for the team award. Teams must be nominated by their institution. Award winners will be selected based upon their documented display of exemplary character and sportsmanship on the field, on campus, and in the community. Specifically, fulfillment of the Core Character Values of **respect, responsibility, integrity, servant leadership** and **sportsmanship** will be taken into consideration.

B. Coach of Character Award

The NAIA Coach of Character Award is an annual award given to a head coach of an NAIA institution. The nominee must be employed by the institution a minimum of 5 years and must be clearly outstanding in embracing the five core values of the NAIA Champions of Character initiative, methods of teaching character through sport, and community leadership through volunteering, service or other means.

C. Dr. LeRoy Walker Character Award

This award was created to honor Dr. LeRoy Walker a former president of the NAIA and President emeritus of the United States Olympic Committee.

The nominee must be a representative of an NAIA institution as a student-athlete. The nominee must be at least a junior academic status at the nominating institution at the time of nomination, and must be “outstanding” in academic achievement (3.0 G.P.A or higher), campus leadership, community leadership, embracing the five core character values of the NAIA Champions of Character initiative, athletic achievement and future ambition.

The recipient will receive a \$1,000 cash award to the institution scholarship fund of recipient’s choice. The recipient also receives a specially engraved plaque/revere bowl as a permanent memento of the award.

The recipient will be provided round-trip transportation to the two awards ceremonies. One ceremony is in conjunction with the annual NAIA National Convention in the spring of 2008 and the other at the Citizen through Sports Alliance Awards Banquet.

D. A. O. Duer Award

Named in honor of the NAIA’s former executive secretary that served the association for 26 years, this award has been annually presented since 1967 to a junior student-athlete in any sport who has excelled in scholarship, character and citizenship.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must have an overall grade point average of at least 3.75 (on a 4.00 scale) and be in her/his junior year academically.

E. Emil S. Liston Award

Named in honor of the NAIA’s first executive secretary and the prime mover behind the men’s basketball tournament, this award has been presented annually since 1950 to a junior men’s or women’s basketball player who has shown high athletic and scholastic achievement.

To be eligible, a student-athlete must have an overall grade point average of at least 3.50 (on a 4.00 scale) and be in her/his junior year academically.

Each award consists of a \$1,000 scholarship presented to the recipient’s institution to be used for tuition and approved expenses and an appropriate award is presented to the honoree.

F. Wally Schwartz Award

The Faculty Athletic Representative Association has initiated this award to honor past Vice-President of Legislative Services, Wally Schwartz. The Award will annually recognize Conference, Regional, and a National FAR of the Year. The intent is to consider members who are FARs in all phases of the FARA on college campuses, conference and regional levels. Registrars are not to be considered for this Award as they have their own association. The recipient should exemplify the loyalty, enthusiasm, and honesty that Wally Schwartz had, and still has, shown on behalf of the NAIA.

G. Charles Morris Award

The award was initiated in memory and honor of past Associate Executive Director Charles Morris. The award is presented annually to recognize Conference, Region and a National Administrator of the Year.

The recipient should exemplify the loyalty and enthusiasm Charles Morris had for the NAIA. Nominees must be active as an administrator at a member institution or in conference/regional committee organizations.

H. Hall of Fame

The NAIA Hall of Fame Award is the highest honor presented by the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. Nominees must be persons of outstanding quality, high moral character, fine leadership ability and must be held in high esteem by their colleagues, former coaches and former athletics. The Hall of Fame program honors individuals in three categories: Meritorious Service, Coach and Athlete.

I. Larry Lady Officiating Award

The Larry Lady Officiating Award is presented annually to an official of any sport recognized by the NAIA. It is named in honor of Larry Lady, current NAIA Supervisor of Officials for basketball, football and baseball, and long-time NAIA supporter and administrator.

Nominees must be persons of outstanding quality, high moral character, fine officiating ability and be held in high esteem by their colleagues, administrators and athletes.

The recipient will receive an award of \$500 to be used by recipient, a member of the recipient's family or family friend who attends an NAIA institution.

V. RATINGS, REPORTING RESULTS AND STATISTICS

A. Ratings

The NAIA Department of Sports Information conducts weekly ratings of the top NAIA men's basketball teams in Divisions I and II. The first regular-season rating for both divisions will be Wednesday, December 5, 2007. A second rating will be compiled December 12. Ratings will resume January 9, 2008, and will continue weekly. The final regular-season rating for Division II will be February 27. The final regular-season rating for Division I will be March 5. Ratings are compiled from a balloting of the Division I rating committee and the Division II rating committee. The NAIA Department of Sports Information compiles the balloting and releases the top 25 rating for each division weekly to national media and affiliated conference/regional information directors. Ratings are available by logging onto the NAIA website at www.naia.org after 3:00 p.m. (CST) each Wednesday of a scheduled rating.

Each sport will have a four person oversight committee charged with upholding the integrity of the national ratings. In addition, each conference/region will be responsible for oversight of their specific rating reports.

Please refer to Appendix C-II for sport-specific rating policies and procedures.

B. Raters

Selection/Identification of Raters

Conference Raters are to be selected at conference level with Conference Commissioner forwarding rater's Name to NAIA office. Conference determines appropriate selection criteria and process.

Two conference calls shall be conducted involving the national raters in each division. The first will occur in January and the second will occur in mid-February. In addition to the two conference calls, the national raters in each division shall:

1. Encourage communication with coaches in conference/independent grouping
2. Participate each week in the ratings process throughout the course of the year
 - a. Review scores from schools within conference/independent grouping each week
 - b. Select the top six teams in affiliated conference/independent grouping each week
 - c. Share top six report with institutions in conference/independent grouping each week
 - d. Base weekly top 30 selections on head-to-head competition, win-loss record (home and away), strength of schedule, strength of affiliated conference/independent grouping in the past year, and weekly top six affiliated conference/independent rankings
 - e. Share top 30 selections with institutions in conference/independent grouping each week
 - e. COMMUNICATE!
3. Attend the men's basketball national championship (strongly encouraged)
4. Evaluate rating process and present recommendations at the NABC-NAIA Annual Business Meeting

Rating committees are standing committees of the NABC-NAIA. **Any rater failing to send in their rating two times during a season will be subject to removed by the Rater Oversight Committee.** Rater terms will be reviewed annually by the conference and the NABC-NAIA Rater Oversight Committee. Following a review, a recommendation shall be made to the oversight committee by late August, and the committee will make a final recommendation to the NAIA by the end of August of each year. Raters may serve consecutive terms.

C. Ratings Timeline

1. Ratings week for all sports defined as 12:01 a.m. Monday through 11:59 p.m. Sunday and all games played during the designated week are to be included in rating.
2. Conference reports to NAIA office by noon (Central) on Monday.
3. National Rating Ballot to NAIA office no later than noon (Central) on Tuesday.
4. Oversight approves/disapproves National Ratings Grid by 9:30 a.m. (Central) on Wednesday.
5. Raters have until noon (Central) on Wednesday to respond with requested rationale.
6. National Ratings released no later than 3 p.m. (Central) on Wednesday.

D. Reporting Results

Mandated by the Council of Affiliated Conferences and Independents, **all contest results must be reported to the NAIA scoreboard or web-synced via DakStats within 24 hours of completion in order to be eligible for team and/or individual weekly ratings and honors.** Please refer to Appendix C for score reporting instructions.

E. Statistics

An in-season, weekly national statistical report is produced utilizing DakStats for the sports of football, basketball, baseball and softball. To be eligible for the statistical report, a student-athlete must play in 75 percent of team games played. Only statistics from games against varsity teams from upper-level, degree-granting institutions should be submitted. Categories will be determined on a sport-by-sport basis and by the NAIA Sports Information Department.

IX. SUNDAY PLAY POLICY

As a matter of policy, NAIA national qualifying and national championship competition will not be scheduled on Sunday. See NAIA Official Handbook for additional information.

XII. PLAYING RULES AND REGULATIONS

A. Playing Rules

Rules governing NAIA regular-season and postseason play are the National Collegiate Athletics Association (NCAA) Men's Basketball Rules. To order an NCAA Rulebook, contact NCAA Publishing, P.O. Box 361147, Indianapolis, Indiana 46236, (phone – 888/388-9748).

B. Game Officials

Game officials for conference play may be selected by the affiliated conference men's basketball committee or the affiliated conference executive committee. Game fees and expense allowances for game officials shall be established by the affiliated conference executive committee.

Since affiliated conference/independent tournament dates are established no later than December 1, the availability of qualified officials should be secured by that date.

The NAIA Division of Championship Services contracts 12 game officials to work the Division I and II national championships. Nominees are submitted by the affiliated conference commissioners and independent institutions. Officials are selected and evaluated by the tournament committee and supervisor of officials, and may be retained for a term of service not to exceed four years. The NCAA Men's Basketball Rules are utilized for all games.

All NAIA affiliated conferences must submit an annual rating of their basketball referees to the national office to assist the National Supervisor of Officials in identifying top-rated officials in each conference as candidates to work NAIA national championships. The official rating forms are sent to each conference commissioner and conferences that fail to submit the annual rating will forfeit the right to have their officials selected to work the following year's NAIA national tournaments.

C. Season Records

Won-loss records for all member institutions participating in men's basketball include **ONLY** those games played against varsity programs at four-year (or two-year upper-level) accredited degree-granting institutions, and **SHALL NOT** include games against junior colleges, clubs, foreign (Canada excluded), or military teams. Competition against institutions holding associate membership in the NAIA and members of the National Christian College Athletic Association should be considered as satisfying this requirement.

D. Official Ball

The official ball for all national championship competition is the **Rawlings VISION**. The NAIA strongly recommends the use of the Rawlings VISION for all regular season and postseason play.

E. Cheerleaders and Spirit Groups

Performance of cheerleaders and other spirit groups are restricted at NAIA regional and national events. The head cheerleader and/or cheerleader sponsor/supervisor is required to sign a Certificate of Clearance for Cheerleaders to Perform that will acknowledge an understanding and compliance of the following policies:

1. Pyramids higher than 2 ½ persons in height are prohibited at NAIA sectional, regional, and/or national events. (Pyramid height is measured by body lengths. A shoulder stand is defined as “2 persons in height”, a chair or shoulder sit is defined as “1 ½” persons high.”)
2. No external force shall be used at an NAIA sectional, regional, and/or national event (for example: trampoline, springboard, clasped hands).
3. Cheerleaders will adhere to the American Association of Cheerleading Coaches and Advisors (AACCA) recommendations and safety guidelines for collegiate cheerleading. To obtain a copy of the policy call 1-800-533-6583.

POSTSEASON COMPETITION

I. RESPONSIBILITIES OF PARTICIPATING INSTITUTIONS

- A.** The official party for each team participating in postseason play is 15. Each institution will be issued up to 21 credentials, with no more than 15 to be used for uniformed players. Upon selection for the affiliated conference tournaments, the official roster must be filed with the NAIA National Office prior to participation in the first affiliated conference postseason tournament game.

The list of up to 15 eligible players (Appendices D-I and D-II) **MUST** be submitted to the NAIA National Office and to the host site by March 8 (Division I) and March 1 (Division II). A copy of this roster **MUST** be hand-carried to the site of the affiliated conference and national tournaments and presented to the supervisor (affiliated conference men’s basketball chair for conference tournaments and the NAIA Administrator for the national championships) prior to that institution’s participation in the tournament.

The deadline for certifying the official roster of 15 players is 30 minutes prior to the first game of any affiliated conference tournament, or at the coaches meeting of the national championship. **Once the tournament begins, no player may play who is not on the official roster.**

A player may be replaced on the official roster between the affiliated conference tournament and the national championship by any eligible player whose name is included on the NAIA Official Eligibility Form for men’s basketball for the 2007-08 season. The coach will need to hand-carry a copy of the eligibility form to each tournament if a roster change is necessary.

Teams must have both light and dark colored uniforms available. Home teams generally wear light colored uniforms and visitors wear dark.

- B.** Each participating team shall be responsible for its own expenses en route to, during, and from all postseason events.
- C.** Each participating team shall provide its own medical, hospitalization, travel and accident insurance for all members of its official party.
- D.** The coach or other designated person for each participating team must be in attendance and responsible for his/her team at all times while at the site of the tournament. This person shall accept the responsibility for the conduct of his/her student-athletes at the tournament site during the tournament and at all activities connected with the team’s tournament participation. In case of property damage, the offending institution shall be held financially responsible.
- E.** Scores from all games of the affiliated conference/independent tournaments must be reported to the NAIA scoreboard via the Dakstats Web-Sync feature within 24 hours of the game/session.

II. AFFILIATED CONFERENCE/INDEPENDENT CHAMPIONSHIPS

Each of the affiliated conferences with six institutions playing men’s basketball in the same division are entitled to qualify its representative to the NAIA Division I or Division II Men’s Basketball National Championship either through regular-season conference play or a postseason conference tournament.

Each qualified affiliated conference receives one berth to the national championship, unless a conference has 10 or more competing institutions, in which case 2 berths will be given. Those conferences with 15 or more will receive 3 berths. Those institutions not eligible for qualification through the affiliated conference process have been assigned as independents for the purpose of qualifying for the NAIA Division I or Division II Men’s Basketball National Championship. Independent institutions will have one qualifying event for Division I to determine the representative to the national tournament. In Division II, the highest rated independent institution in the final top 25 rating will receive an automatic berth to the national tournament.

Those institutions which have not qualified for the national championship by winning the conference championship or by earning one of the independent slots may be considered for an at-large berth. The number of available at-large berths varies for each tournament.

Conference and independent playoff plans must be submitted no later than December 1 each year.

A. Dates and Sites

The dates and sites of the affiliated conference/independent men's basketball championships shall be determined by the affiliated conference executive committees/independent tournament coordinator. The deadline date for completion of the men's basketball affiliated conference/independent championships is midnight on:

Division I: March 11, 2008

Division II: March 4, 2008

All postseason games must be played on an official court measuring 94' x 50', with seating for a minimum of 750, and with rectangular glass backboards. It shall be the responsibility of the appropriate conference committee to consider such items as lighting, spectator comfort, player accommodations, a minimum of four feet of space between the boundary line of the court and bleachers and/or chairs, and normal liability precautions when approving host sites. A careful inspection of game facilities for spectator and participants' safety shall be conducted prior to each game.

B. Administration

Affiliated conference tournaments are under the direct control and supervision of the leadership of the individual conferences. It is recommended that the affiliated conference commissioner/president or a representative of the conference executive committee be present at all conference tournament games as the tournament supervisor. Each affiliated conference is responsible for:

1. Administration and interpretation of the conference playoff plan, including all qualifications and selection procedures.
2. Certification of approved sites for playoff games.
3. Announcement of participating teams, seedings, pairings, game times, and sites immediately at the established time for final team selection.
4. Assignment of a tournament supervisor to each game/session site and provision of complete instructions for game/session administration.
5. Assignment of a certified athletic trainer.
6. Establishing physician and ambulance service on-site or immediately on call throughout the tournament.
7. Approving the selection and assignment of all tournament officials.
8. Reporting results of all tournament games to the NAIA National Office.
9. Ordering the championship awards.
10. Appealing policies, if necessary.
11. Videotaping all postseason tournament games. If no tournament is held, a tape of the last game played for each team should be used for the film exchange.
12. Supervising the administration of the game(s) including pre-game protocol, cheerleader activity, crowd control, supervision of the game officials, and the post-game awards ceremony.

III. NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

A. Administration

The NAIA Division I and II Men's Basketball National Championships are under the direct control and supervision of the NAIA Men's Basketball Tournament Committees which are appointed by the NABC-NAIA. The tournament committees are responsible for carrying out the policies approved by the Council of Athletic Administrators such as seeding of participating teams, the management of the national tournament games, and the general welfare of the participating teams and coaches. Other responsibilities include conducting a tournament coaches meeting, working with, evaluating, and assigning game officials, and coordinating both pre- and post-tournament ceremonies. Should a member of the tournament committee have his/her team qualify for the national championship, the NAIA Men's Basketball Administrator will appoint an alternate to take his/her place on the committee.

B. Qualification of Teams

Each affiliated conference with six teams competing in the same division shall automatically qualify one representative to the national championship of its respective division. For the 2007-08 season, one qualifying event in Division I will determine independent the representative for the national championship. The top rated independent institution (top 25 only) in Division II will receive an automatic berth to the national championship. The remaining at-large berths shall go to the highest-rated teams in either the Division I or Division II men's basketball final rating. A host berth shall be granted to College of the Ozarks for the Division II championship should they fail to qualify through these qualification procedures.

In the event two or more teams receive the same number of points (tied) in the final rating, and are ranked in a position to receive an at-large berth, the tie will be broken as follows:

1. The team with the highest number of first place votes in the final rating will be selected for filling the at-large berth.
2. If a tie still exists, the team with the highest number of points in the previous national rating will be selected to fill the at-large berth.
3. If a tie still exists, repeat step 2, looking at each previous rating until the tie is broken.

C. Format

The final round of the Division I and II men's basketball championship series is a 32-team, single-elimination national tournament. The first round (16 games) is played on Wednesday and Thursday. The second round (8 games) is conducted on Friday. The quarterfinals (4 games) are held on Saturday evening. The semifinals (2 games) are played on Monday. The tournament concludes with the championship game on Tuesday evening.

D. Seeding

The 32 teams in each championship are seeded based on a composite ranking of the national rating committee and NABC-NAIA seeding and bracketing policies. A conference call that includes the NABC-NAIA President, Tournament Committee Chair, NAIA Men's Basketball Administrator, and the NAIA Director of Sports Information will be held to determine the final bracket. The conference call participants shall:

1. Confirm composite ranking of the 32 qualified teams.
2. Place teams on a straight 32-team bracket (1-32, 2-31, 3-30, etc.)
3. Adjust the bracket to accommodate the following NABC-NAIA policies:
 - a. Teams that have played in the regular season will not be paired in the first round.
 - b. Teams from the same conference will not be placed in the same half of the bracket, or if three teams from the same conference qualify, they will be placed in three different quarters.
 - c. Teams located in the Eastern time zone will not be scheduled in the last game of the night session in the first round.
 - d. Teams located in the Mountain, Pacific, or Hawaiian time zones will not be scheduled in the first game of the day session in the first round.
 - e. The time schedule shall be drawn so as to permit a rest period of 24 hours between starting times of games for any given team. The tournament draw may occasionally cause an exception to this rule.
 - f. The evening games shall generally be assigned to the top seeded teams and/or to those teams considered to have the best attendance drawing power.
 - g. Teams that are paired in the second round must have played on the same day in the first round of the tournament. The tournament draw and other bracketing policies may cause exceptions to this rule.
 - h. The Seeding and Bracketing Committee has the prerogative to adjust seedings and/or game times to comply with the criteria above.
 - i. Television requests for starting games times will be honored if available. Radio requests cannot be honored in assigning game times.

Official seeding, opening-round pairings, and game times are announced by the NAIA National Office on March 12, (Division I) and March 5 (Division II).

E. Tournament Selection Process Appeals

If there is misapplication of NAIA policy and procedures regarding tournament selection, an institution may appeal to the national office of the NAIA.

Criteria for filing an appeal

1. A written appeal citing the specific NAIA policies and/or procedures that have been misapplied must be submitted to the NAIA National Office - Department of Championships within 24 hours (or noon (central time) of the next business day if the end of the 24 hour period falls on a non-business day) from the time the tournament field has been released.
2. Once an appeal has been submitted a response will be provided within 24 hours from receipt of appeal.
3. **Appeals must be submitted and signed by the Athletics Director and President of the institution.**

NOTE: The Council of Athletics Administrators sport liaison will be on the selection conference call to listen to the discussion of tournament selection.

The liaison will report any concerns to the National Office immediately following the conclusion of the conference call.

The oversight committee will review ratings to prevent any ratings process violations or unethical use of the ratings process.

F. Team Travel/Reimbursement Policies

Championship events are to be financially independent in that income from those events is to cover expenses of the event. A program of national and local sponsors is to be developed for the purpose of providing sufficient money (together with event income) to allow schools to participate in national championships at minimum expense to the institution.

The association will not reimburse meal costs of participating teams or individuals.

In order to minimize travel expenses, the NAIA has entered into an agreement with Anthony Travel for air travel. This arrangement offers the NAIA and its member institutions the services of the nation's leading air travel company specializing in sports and association travel.

National Championship participants will be reimbursed, provided the event generates sufficient income, based upon travel expenses first and, should income cover 100% of travel, housing expenses will then be covered with remaining income.

1. **Transportation** - Travel reimbursement to member institutions participating in NAIA postseason events are not guaranteed by the association for any event.

Only those institutions that secure air travel through Anthony Travel (866/284-NAIA) shall be eligible for event travel reimbursement. All air travel expenses incurred shall be the financial responsibility of the institution. The NAIA will reimburse from remaining championship profits up to 100 percent of the air travel expense of the 15-member official party to those institutions which used the NAIA travel service. Airline reservations made through any other source will not qualify for reimbursement.

If traveling by air, the cost of ground transportation from campus to airport and return is not a reimbursable expense.

Institutions located within 500 miles of the event shall receive travel reimbursement based on ground transportation rates regardless of whether the team flies or drives.

Institutions located from 501-600 miles from the event may be reimbursed for either ground or air transportation at the NAIA's discretion, depending upon geography and distance from the NAIA designated airports.

At-site/local transportation is included in the team travel expenses unless provided by host.

2. **Lodging** - All teams will be assigned to a specific hotel by the NAIA, and 8-10 rooms will be blocked for each of the team's official party of 15 persons. Teams pay all room, tax, and incidental charges. All participating teams must stay at the assigned property designated by the NAIA to be eligible for participation and reimbursement.

G. Inclement Weather Policy

If inclement weather should cause travel delays for any team(s) competing in the national tournament, it will be up to the discretion of the NAIA event administrator and the tournament committee to make changes to the championship bracket to accommodate such delays.

H. Additional Information

Prior to the tournament, an information packet will be distributed to all potential qualifiers which will include specific instructions regarding transportation, housing, practices, and all responsibilities upon qualification. Please handle these responsibilities as early as possible.

1. **Contacting the National Office** - Immediately upon qualifying for the national championship, all affiliated conference champions are to contact the NAIA National Office to identify its team as the representative to the national championship. If notifying the National Office after hours or on weekends, leave the information on the voicemail. The following information should be telephoned (816-595-8000), faxed (816-595-8000) or e-mailed (update@naia.org) to the NAIA National Office no later than March 11 (Division I) and March 4 (Division II):
 - a. Institution, affiliated conference, and division.
 - b. Score of conference championship game, opponent, and current record.
 - c. Roster changes, if applicable.
 - d. Game-by-game results, individual and team cumulative statistics for all games including affiliated conference tournament games.
 - e. Method of transportation, flight number and airline (if applicable), and estimated time of arrival at the championship site.
 - f. Name(s) of local media covering the team at the national championship.
 - g. Number of banquet tickets required in addition to the official traveling party of 15.
2. **Film Exchange** - All teams qualifying for the national championship must bring a videotape of their last game on VHS format to the coaches' meeting at the national championship, to exchange with their first round opponent. This policy is to be monitored by the National Basketball Coaches Association-NAIA Division. Coaches not participating in the film exchange will be reported to the chair of the tournament committee, and a letter will be sent to the athletics director (copy to the president) of said institution that the coach has neglected to follow NABC-NAIA policy. **New for 2007-08 – Exchanged videos MUST be original recordings on new tapes and accompanied by a box score from the videotaped game.**

In addition, a \$500 fine will be assessed to the institution. The videotapes must be returned to the Tournament Committee prior to each game of the tournament. **Teams that fail to return a videotape prior to their game at the national tournament will be assessed a \$500 fine.** They will be catalogued by the Tournament Committee and given to each team's opponent throughout the tournament. The NABC-NAIA has adopted a policy requiring that all video tapes must be unedited.
3. **Team Statistics** – Team statistics must be submitted to the national office for inclusion in the media press book. Any team failing to submit statistics will be fined \$500.00 at the conclusion of the championship.
4. **Check In/Out** - Upon arrival in Kansas City or Branson, teams must check in prior to the coaches meeting the day prior to the beginning of the tournament at NAIA Headquarters. NAIA personnel will be at the headquarters to greet all teams, provide informational packets, and be available to answer questions.

Team head coaches or authorized representatives are required to check out at NAIA headquarters following their last game and prior to departure from Kansas City or Branson. At this time, all credentials and passes must be surrendered to the authorized NAIA representative. **A fine will be assessed for each credential/pass not returned.**
5. **Banquet** - There will be a pre-tournament banquet the evening prior to the beginning of play to recognize the participating teams and NAIA Hall of Fame inductees. **All teams** are required to be in attendance at this function and appropriate dress is required. Each participating team shall be given 15 complimentary banquet tickets.

6. **Coaches Meeting** - There will be a pre-tournament meeting of all coaches prior to the banquet. This meeting shall serve as an informational forum and will include a briefing by a representative of the game officials. **Coaches are required to attend this meeting.**
7. **Opening Ceremonies** - The Parade of Champions—involving all teams, honorary coaches and championship officials—will be held the first evening of competition to officially open the event. **All teams** are required to participate in this function in full uniform.
8. **Honorary Coaches** - An “Honorary Coach” program has been organized for the national tournament. Local businesses and civic groups are obtained to serve as local hosts for each of the teams. Honorary coaches sit with their teams at the banquet, sit on the benches during games, march in the parade of champions, and are generally available to assist teams and make them feel welcome while at the championship.

Teams are requested to provide two team jackets for their honorary coaches to wear during the tournament. It is considered quite appropriate for teams to provide their honorary coaches with a gift emblematic of their institution or hometown.
9. **Radio and Television** - The broadcast of any tournament game is governed by broadcast policies as printed in the NAIA Policy Handbook.

10. **Notice for Fans** - All ticket holders voluntarily assume all risks of property loss and personal injury. Management may revoke the license and eject or refuse entry to the holder by refunding the stated purchase price. The holder agrees that the City of Kansas City/Municipal Auditorium (Division I) and College of the Ozarks (Division II) and its agents, the NAIA and its agents, and the participants are not liable for injuries resulting from attendance at this event. The holder agrees that alcoholic beverages in any form shall not be allowed to be sold, dispersed, or brought into the public area of this event.

IV. FINANCIAL POLICIES

An affiliated conference may establish a guarantee to be paid by the host institution for tournament games/sessions. The amount of this guarantee is established by the affiliated conference executive committee.

It is recommended that monies received by the affiliated conference tournaments are used to defray the expenses of the institutions participating in the national championships representing the conference.

A. Transportation/Lodging/Meals

Expense allowances may be paid for each traveling institution's official party (maximum of 15 persons) at the discretion of the affiliated conference following the completion of the affiliated conference tournament.

Expense allowances will be paid for each traveling institution's official party (maximum of 15 persons) at the discretion of the NAIA National Office. Reimbursement will be determined following the completion of the National Tournament, submission of expenses by traveling teams and submission of income/expenses from the affiliated conference/independent tournaments. **NOTE: Travel reimbursement to member institutions is not guaranteed by the association for any event.**

The following expense reimbursement guidelines will be followed:

- 1. Transportation -**
 - a. Travel by car, station wagon or van (regardless of number of vehicles): \$.45 per mile round trip, irrespective of distance traveled.
 - b. Travel by commercial carrier: 50% of total cost (must submit receipt).
 - c. Travel by air: face value of the ticket.
- 2. Lodging -** Maximum of 8 room nights.
- 3. Meals -** No reimbursement shall be made to any traveling team for meal expenses incurred to and from and while at the game site.

4. Assist with score reporting of all games in conference tournaments to the national office via phone (816) 595-8000 or the NAIA Scoreboard

National Tournament Committee

1. Confirm composite ranking of the 32 qualified teams and place on a straight 32-team bracket
2. Adjust bracket to accommodate scheduling, time zone, and television policies/requests
3. Supervise competing teams: greet upon arrival, prepare informational material, coordinate practice sessions, conduct pre-tournament coaches' meeting, assist with local information/arrangements, and coordinate team check-out, including clearance from hotel and all other responsibilities
4. Supervise game officials: greet upon arrival, coordinate assignments, and inform of all meetings, official functions, special interpretations, and evaluations
5. Supervise all games of the tournament: site inspection, preparation of the bench area, pregame lineups, player/coach conduct, liaison to the game officials, and other items related to the administration of the games
6. Arbitrate/determine decisions involving player/coach conduct and matters beyond the jurisdiction of the officials
7. Coordinate pre-tournament and post-tournament ceremonies
8. Assist the NAIA administrator and the host-site coordinator on other matters related to the tournament



APPENDIX C-II

NAIA Men's Basketball Ratings Manual

2007-08 Season

I General Information

- A Frequency of Ratings:** The NAIA conducts a preseason rating to be released October 31. NAIA Men's Basketball ratings are conducted on a weekly basis beginning the first full week in December. There will only be two ratings in December (December 5 & 12). Ratings will resume on January 9, 2008 and continue every Wednesday ending February 27 (DII) and March 5 (DI). (December 5, 12, January 9, 16, 23, 30, February 6, 13, 20, 27 (end for DII), March 5 (end for DI))
- B Total Number of Raters:** The Division I rating committee is comprised of 11 raters. The Division II rating committee is comprised of 17 raters. Each conference has one rater and a rater is chosen to represent the independents.
- C Release of Rating:** The Top 25 Poll is released on Wednesdays by 3 p.m. (Central) and posted on-line at www.naia.org.
- D Reporting Period:** All games played **Monday through Sunday**.

II Expectations of Raters

- A** The NAIA expects every rater to have an unbiased opinion as to conference affiliation. Each rater is expected to rate the top 30 teams in the nation, regardless of conference affiliation.
- B** The NAIA expects every rater to submit requested information by the designated deadlines.
- C** If you are unable to fulfill your commitment as a rater, the NAIA Sports Information Department must be notified immediately.

III Reporting Scores

- A Mandate for reporting scores:** In order for schools to be eligible for the national ratings, results from games **must** be reported to the NAIA Scoreboard **within** 24 hours of completion of contest. It is the responsibility of each school to report its respective scores. Institutions failing to report statistics and/or results any two weeks during the reporting period will not be eligible for the national statistical reports or ratings for the remainder of the season.
- B Avenues for reporting:** Scores can manually be entered at www.naiasports.org/admin or scores can be Web-Synced via the DakStats Web-Sync feature.
1. To register for the NAIA Scoreboard, visit www.naiasports.org/admin and click on "Don't have a password? Click here to register now."
 2. Complete the information and enter a school-based e-mail and a password of your choice.
 3. All registrations must be approved by the NAIA prior to access being granted, so please allow ample time for approval.
 4. If you have an active account with SID-Help, you do not have to re-register. Your username/password is already in the system.

IV Rating Procedure

A Top 6's

1. Each rater is to receive scores from teams in their respective conference only for each reporting week. Deadlines for receipt of scores is determined by the rater and the conference.
2. Top 6 rankings are to be submitted to the NAIA no later than **Noon (Central)** every Monday during the rating season. Top 6's **must** be submitted via the on-line rating system: www.naiasports.org/admin. The following information must be included for every team:
 - Team's overall Win/Loss record
 - Team's conference Win/Loss record
 - Result of each game for the ranking period – Win/Loss and the Score
 - Site & Opponent
 - Opponent Affiliation, if not an NAIA member institution (NCAA DI, DII, DIII, NCCAA, Other)
 - Team's ranking in the previous week's national poll (the NAIA's and other affiliations')
3. The NAIA will compile all Conference Top 6's for distribution to raters and for posting on the NAIA website. Raters will receive e-mail notification when all of the Top 6's are compiled.
4. Top 6's received after the deadline will **not** be included in the compilation.
5. If a conference rater fails to submit a conference rating, teams in that conference are NOT eligible for that weekly rating.

B Conference Ratings

1. **One** tie at any position (#1-#5) is allowed by the rater on their ballot. Only one tie is allowed and the conference rating is still limited to only six teams.
2. Rater has **one** chance to correct Conference Report should more than one tie appear. If not corrected, Conference Report will be removed.

C Ballots

Every Top 30 ballot is due to the national office on Tuesdays by **Noon (Central)**. Please keep the following in mind when submitting ballots:

- Include name, phone (cell) number, date, and conference on the ballot.
- Raters must vote in conference order; ie the #2 team in a conference can not be ranked higher than the #1 team in the same conference.
- Designate the state of **every** team ranked. The NAIA can not assume a certain team was intended for ranking purposes. The NAIA will NOT make that distinction on any ballot and may result in that team not receiving the intended points.
- List the record for **every** team on your Top 30 ballot.
- No ties are allowed. If a tie is indicated, both teams will be omitted from the ballot.
- Double check the ballot for teams that may have been ranked twice.
- **New for 2007-08:** Faxed ballots will **not** be accepted. Submit your ballot via e-mail. A response confirming receipt will be returned. The NAIA is **not** responsible for securing ratings. Ballots received after the Noon deadline will **not** be included in the rating.
- A rating will not be conducted if 50% of the raters do not submit a ballot.

D Corrections to Region Top 6's / National Ratings

1. For incorrect information regarding record and/or scores in Conference Top 6 reports, contact respective Conference Rater.
2. For incorrect information regarding overall record in national rating, contact both Conference Rater and NAIA Sports Information Department.
3. For concerns regarding the integrity of Conference Top 6, contact respective Conference Rater and Conference Commissioner.
4. For concerns regarding the integrity of the national rating, contact respective Conference Rater, a National Oversight Committee member and/or the NAIA Championship Administrator.

V National Oversight Committee

A National Oversight Committee to consist of:

1. Member of Ratings Task Force (CACI sport liaison)
2. Three coaches from appropriate sport with the following criteria:
 - a. One coach must have prior rating experience
 - b. One coach must be current officer in coaches association
 - c. An active or former coach still involved in the NAIA with significant previous experience as coach and/or rater.

The NAIA Championship Administrator to work with officers to recruit/appoint National Oversight Committee members.

B Ratings Task Force/CACI liaison is an active member of each National Oversight Committee.

C **NEW CACI/Ratings Task Force policy for 2007-08:** Each conference must designate a three-person oversight committee to monitor conference ratings. Conference Commissioners will provide names and contact information for conference oversight committee members to the national office. If a conference does not have a designated oversight committee in place, they will not be able to submit conference and national ratings.

D National Oversight Committee will review each rating grid prior to releasing national rating.

1. Approval forms to be submitted by each National Oversight Committee member via e-mail.
2. If a concern is expressed, oversight will contact NAIA Championship Administrator immediately.
3. If concern is expressed by oversight regarding a rating ballot, rater in question will have until **Noon (Central)** on Wednesdays to respond to oversight's concerns and provide rationale for rating.

New for 2007—If a rater does not provide rationale-

- 1st case – written warning (ballot is still figured into rating for that week)
- 2nd case w/no written rationale from rater – ballot is removed for that week
- NAIA administrator copies all parties (rater, national oversight, region chair) in each instance)

4. No response from National Oversight Committee member for two-week period constitutes NAIA National Office intervention/call.

E National Oversight Committee has authority to remove a rater's ballot if the ballot is deemed to jeopardize the integrity of the rating. Removal of ballot must be requested by minimum of 50% of National Oversight Committee.

1. In the event of the removal of a ballot, the rater, Conference Commissioner, NAIA Director of Sports Information, NAIA Director of Championships and NAIA Championship Administrator will be notified.

F Removal of rater authorized in the case of the following:

1. Failure to submit conference or national rating.
2. Failure to represent conference on a ratings conference call.
3. Removal of ballot twice in ratings period.

G. New for 2007-08 from the Ratings Task Force: Standard policies when removing a rater:

1. Warning letter (e-mail correspondence) sent to rater after first offense (See section F above). Respective conference commissioner copied on all correspondences.
2. Removal of rater after second offense. NAIA Administrator contacts conference commissioner for procedures in submitting conference ratings in rater's absence.

NOTE: If a conference has its rater removed, the conference loses its rater voting privileges for the remainder of the current ratings season. However, the conference **MUST** still submit a conference rating so that teams in the conference can receive ratings votes from all other raters.

VI Ratings Grievance Procedure

A Conference Oversight Committee responsible for Conference Report

B Rater-to-Rater grievance to be facilitated through NAIA Championship Administrator with Oversight Committee serving as liaison/resource.

1. Appeals to be processed through Ratings Task Force.

VII Selection/Identification of Raters

A Conference raters are to be selected at conference level with conference forwarding rater contact information to national office. Conference determines appropriate selection criteria and process.

VIII Final Rating

A Results of every contest up to submission of Final Conference Report is to be included for final rating.

IX Other Information

A *Conference Calls:* There are two calls during the season. Information concerning these calls will be provided to each rater by the championship administrator prior to the calls. Substitutions (assistant coaches, non-rater coach from same conference, etc.) are not permitted on conference calls. If you are not able to participate on a ratings conference call, contact the NAIA Administrator.

B *Contact From Coaches:* Coaches are permitted to send information to their respective conference rater only. It is strongly suggested that no coaches, regardless of their conference, contact a rater outside their conference. If, as a rater, you are receiving correspondence from a coach outside your conference, please contact the Oversight Committee.

C *Questions Regarding Rating Procedure:* Any questions regarding the ratings procedures (SID Help, log-in access, etc.) should be directed to the NAIA Director of Sports Information.

Appendix L

CONSTITUTION OF NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF BASKETBALL COACHES – NAIA DIVISION (NABC-NAIA)

ARTICLE I NAME

Section 1. The name of this association shall be the National Association of Basketball Coaches – NAIA Division.

ARTICLE II ORGANIZATION

Section 1. The membership of this association is comprised of men's basketball coaches whose institutions are current members of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics. The NABC-NAIA is charged with the responsibility of carrying out programs beneficial to the game of basketball and to the NAIA member coaches of this sport. The activities of this section shall be in accordance with the aims and objectives of NAIA and under the guidance of the Council of Athletics Administrators.

Section 2. The NABC-NAIA shall submit to the NAIA Council of Athletics Administrators statements governing the NABC-NAIA plans and practices for approval and in every way cooperate with the CAA in furthering the stated aims and objectives of this parent organization.

ARTICLE III AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

Section 1. The NABC-NAIA shall supervise and conduct programs utilizing the guidance of the NAIA Council of Athletics Administrators which will foster and promote interest and enthusiasm in basketball programs which will produce national, regional, and conference recognition for teams, players and coaches.

ARTICLE IV MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. Active membership in NABC-NAIA will be open to any men's basketball coach whose institution is a current member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics.

ARTICLE V VOTING POWER

Section 1. Current membership of NABC-NAIA entitles the member to one vote per school in all democratic action held in open assembly of the association.

ARTICLE VI OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers shall be elected from the active membership of the association at the Annual Meeting as follows: President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President, Secretary and Past-President. Such elected officers shall be from institutions which are in good standing in the NAIA.

Section 2. Term of office of the President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President and Secretary shall be for one year.

Section 3. The progression in office shall be from Secretary to 2nd Vice-President to 1st Vice-President to President. Each office to be held for one year from one Annual Meeting to the next Annual Meeting. In the event of a vacancy, the normal progression from 2nd Vice-President to President will be accelerated to fill the vacant office and the President of NABC-NAIA is empowered to appoint members for the membership at large to fill the remaining vacant position. Such appointee will not succeed in the normal progression of offices unless duly elected by the membership at the next Annual Election.

Section 4. The Nominating Committee shall be appointed by the President and shall consist of the First Vice-President (chairman) and two additional members selected by the president. This committee shall submit nominations for NABC-NAIA offices and committees. In addition to nominations from the Nominating Committee, nominations for office may be accepted from the floor. Election for the offices of 2nd Vice-President or Secretary shall be determined by the highest number of votes. The election shall be under the direction of the chairman of the Nominating Committee.

ARTICLE VIII DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

- Section 1. The duties of the President are to afford leadership and guidance to the NABC-NAIA through all possible channels and to direct his efforts specifically to conduction the Annual Meetings and clinics. The President is the executive officer of all appointed and standing committees of the association.
- Section 2. The duties of the 1st Vice-President are assuming the leadership at all meetings unattended by the president and serve as chair of the All-America Scholar-Athlete Committee.
- Section 3. The 2nd Vice-President is designated as the membership chairman and he works directly with the regional chairmen who are designated as regional membership chairmen. The 2nd Vice-President assumes the leadership designated to the President or 1st Vice-President in the event neither is available to assume their proper roles.
- Section 4. The Secretary-Treasurer shall make an annual report to the NABC-NAIA Executive Committee, supervise the association correspondence, maintain the roster, notify members of meetings and other such duties as are incident to the office.

ARTICLE IX EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

- Section 1. The Executive Committee of NABC-NAIA is composed of six members; the officers of the association, the association's immediate past-president and the appointed NAIA Council of Athletics Administrators liaison (ex-officio).

ARTICLE X MEETINGS

- Section 1. The Annual Business Meeting of the association shall be held in conjunction with the National Association of Basketball Coaches Annual Convention at the time and place set by the officers of NAIA.
- Section 2. Voting on all issues shall be by voice or hand in executive sessions or in the open meetings of the association.
- Section 3. Usual order of business at the open business meetings:
- (1) Reading of Minutes
 - (2) Reports of officers
 - (3) Committee reports
 - (4) Old business
 - (5) New business
 - (6) Adjournment

ARTICLE XI AMENDMENTS

- Section 1. A proposed constitutional amendment shall be presented in writing to the President of NABC-NAIA for Executive Committee action. Upon approval of the Executive Committee, amendment must win two-thirds approval vote of current members of NABC-NAIA present at the Annual Business Meeting before amending of constitution will occur. Final approval must be given by the NABC-NAIA Executive Committee and the NAIA Council of Athletics Administrators.

ARTICLE XII COMMITTEES

- Section 1. The President of the NABC-NAIA is empowered to appoint committees which will assist in programs designed to produce national, regional and conference recognition for teams, players and coaches. The President is also encouraged to appoint competent NABC-NAIA members who will assist in any and all ways to foster the aims and objectives of NAIA as they relate to the game of basketball, the participants, the coaches, the spectators and the institutions represented by these groups.
