THE UNITED STATES NAVAL ACADEMY

Secretary of the Navy George Bancroft laid the foundation for the Naval Academy when, in 1845, he established the Naval School at Fort Severn in Annapolis. Commander Franklin Buchanan served as the first Superintendent. His faculty consisted of four officers and three civilian professors. There were 50 students. Initially, the academic and professional instruction required five years—the first and last at Annapolis, with the intervening three at sea.

In 1850, the Naval School became the United States Naval Academy. The following year, the Academy adopted its current course of instruction which includes four consecutive years at Annapolis, with at-sea training provided during the summers.

The Naval Academy moved to Newport, R.I., during the Civil War. In 1865, it was re-established at Annapolis under the leadership of Vice Admiral David Dixon Porter. During these early years, the Academy was one of the few institutions of higher learning offering a sophisticated undergraduate course in technical education.

The late 19th century saw immense changes in naval technology with the conversion from sail-powered, wooden ships to steam-powered vessels of steel, which also resulted in rapid developments in naval weaponry and tactics. With the Spanish-American War in 1898, the United States became a world naval power, and early Naval Academy graduates like George Dewey and Alfred Thayer Mahan made significant contributions to our national heritage.

The new century saw the nation's undergraduate naval college grow in size and academic prowess. The Class of 1895 had produced 41 graduates. By World War I, there were nearly 200 graduates each year, along with 2,500 reserve officers who received their training at the Academy.

With the entry of the United States into World War I, courses were shortened to three years, a program which remained in effect until 1921.

Between the two world wars, the curriculum and training equipment were modernized to keep pace with rapid advances in the naval profession and American education. In 1930, the Association of American Universities accredited the Naval Academy, and in 1933, an act of Congress authorized the Naval Academy to confer the degree of bachelor of science on graduates, beginning with the Class of 1931. Congress authorized award of the degree to all living graduates in 1939. The Middle Atlantic States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools first accredited the Academy in 1947.

During World War II, summer sessions were instituted and the course was again shortened to three years. As during World War I, reserve officers, along with reserve midshipmen, also trained at the Academy.

In 1963, the Academy initiated the Trident Scholar Program, under which a number of exceptional students are permitted to pursue independent research during the first class (senior) year.

The 1964-65 academic year saw the civilian positions of academic dean and dean of admissions established and far-reaching changes made to the curriculum. The number of required core courses was reduced and, for the first time, each midshipman was allowed to pursue academic areas of individual interest for minor or major. Additional changes, introduced in the 1969-70 academic year, now require every midshipman to complete a major.

In 1975, President Gerald R. Ford signed legislation authorizing admission of women to the service academies. The first women midshipmen entered the Academy in July 1976 and graduated with the Class of 1980.

2004 OUTLOOK

The bad taste left in the mouth of the Navy men's water polo team after narrowly missing a bid to the NCAA tournament in 2002 has now been replaced with the taste of sweet success. The Mids made their 11th trip to the coveted 2003 national championship after outlasting nemesis Princeton, 8-6, in the Eastern Championship title game, earning an automatic berth to the four-team field.

Although the moment was savored, and the close games against eventual champion Southern California (10-6) and Loyola Marymount (10-7) were exciting, the returning members of the 2004 squad are not content to let that be the end of another great season, but the starting point for a run at greatness.

The Mids suffered several key losses to graduation in the form of All-American Joe Donahue, and classmates Tim Fox, Paul Kepner and Bill Miente. All four were contributors to the program for four years and offered leadership that will be challenging to replace. Eager to step into that leadership role, however, are four new seniors who have also made great contributions to the program.

Senior captain Patrick Rollo heads up a class of talented seniors. Pat is very deserving of his position as captain, commented head coach Mike Schofield. He has been one of our leaders in and out of the pool for three years now.

Rollo has continually increased his offensive output during his first three years on the squad, finishing with a career-best 38 goals last season. He was a Second-Team All-East player a year ago, and is expected to return to that form again in his final season.

Joining Rollo as members of the most veteran class are James Sauls, Joe Snelgrove and Michael Suriano.

The three classmates who join Rollo are also good leaders, said Schofield. As in past years, the team will go as the seniors go, so it's up to this group to provide the leadership.

Snelgrove is a two-year starter who put together his most successful season a year ago with 22 goals and 18 assists. Sauls and Suriano have seen limited time through the first few seasons, but are looking to make big contributions in their final go around.

Excitement is high for the return of juniors Jordan Gentry and Alex Ratcliffe, each keys to Navy's success a year ago. Gentry emerged as one of the Mids top offensive threats last season, finishing the year with 29 goals and a team-best 27 assists. In addition to his increased scoring, Gentry also finished second on the team, behind only goalkeeper Patrick McCreary, with 41 steals.

Ratcliffe proved his freshman campaign was no fluke with a standout sophomore season for Navy. The 2-Meter player was First-Team All-East and on the NCAA all-tournament team after scoring 41 a career-best 41 goals and handing out 26 assists.

Juniors Nick Macola, James Tripiano and Alex Owre were all among the consistent contributors last season and are expected to enhance their roles this year. Classmates Don Anderson, Bryan Lingle and Jordan Flacco have also worked hard in the offseason and are making a case for themselves to vie for a starting position or increased playing time.

Also stepping up and challenging for minutes are sophomores Todd Carlson, Connor Herron, Josh Lewis, John Money and Andrew Plumb. With a year under their belts, this group of players has seen what it takes to succeed and are eager to make their contributions to the Navy pro-

gram.

We have a great nucleus returning, said Schofield. It's going to be a battle for a starting position, and our upperclassmen know that. It's going to come down to who worked the hardest in the spring and over the summer.

One of the biggest changes from last year is the depth at the goal-keeping position. In 2003, Schofield was faced with the task of replacing three-time All-American and 2002 Southern Division Player of the Year Nick Hill. He turned to McCreary, a field player as a rookie, and asked him to learn a new position. The gamble paid off, as McCreary became Navy's primary goalkeeper last season, stopping nearly 50.0% of the shots that came his way, and recording a team-high 61 steals from his position in the net.

Challenging McCreary for a starting role will be four other capable goaltenders in junior Jeff Cummings, sophomore Matthew Warnecke, and freshmen Steve Craney and George Naughton.

I'm really excited about our goalkeeping situation this year, said Schofield. Jeff (Cummings) and Matthew (Warnecke) have really been pushing Patrick (McCreary), and the freshman have been looking good in the early going.

Cummings and Warnecke each saw limited time in a game setting last year, but gained valuable experience in practice and made the most of their playing time. Craney, at 6-4, and Naughton, at 6-2, bring some welcome height to the netminding position.

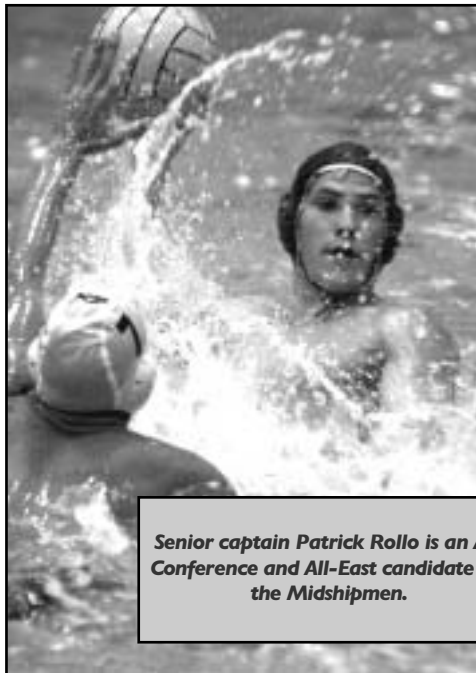
Schofield has brought in another large freshman class with 14 new faces on the roster. With a solid nucleus of returnees, he is excited for the battles for playing time that the big and talented rookie crop represents.

The guys coming back all know that the starting positions are open, commented Schofield. We have a depth we haven't had in previous years, so the theme will be friendly, healthy competition to see who gets to play the most.

Navy's schedule is again one of the most challenging in the East. The Mids open the year hosting the Navy Open on Labor Day weekend. The squad will start things off with a bang, playing Loyola Marymount, the same team that ended Navy's season a year ago at the NCAA Championship. Things don't get any easier from there as the Midshipmen play Long Beach State, California and Santa Cruz before the weekend is over.

The Mids then take the road for games at Air Force against the Falcons and UCLA, before returning back to the area for CWPA Southern Division League Games at Johns Hopkins and George Washington. Navy makes a mid-September trip to Boston for the ECAC Tournament, before heading out to the University of the Pacific for the challenging Northern California Tournament in early October. Two more sets of league games serve as the tune-up for the Southern Division Championship, held at Princeton, the last weekend in October. The Mids look to reclaim the crown before moving on to defend their title at the Eastern Championship at Bucknell in mid-November.

Our goal is to always be contending for a championship, said Schofield. We are opening the year with the highest level of competition we have had in years. That will not only give us a gauge for where we are, but it will also prepare us for league play and the championship season.

HEAD COACH MIKE SCHOFIELD

HEAD COACH • 20TH SEASON • PITTSBURGH '79

Mike Schofield returns for his 20th season at the helm of the Navy water polo program. Under six Eastern Championships and competed in 11 NCAA Tournaments. Eleven Navy athletes have earned All-America honors under Schofield, most recently driver Joe Donahue, a third-team selection last year for the first time in his career. Donahue's selection to the All-American squad marks the fifth-straight year a member of Schofield's team has earned the national distinction. Recent graduate Nick Hill was an Honorable Mention All-American in his final three seasons, Sean Foster was named Second-Team All-America in 2000, and Jason Pace made the honorable mention team in 1999.

Schofield is well recognized in the water polo community, having also coached on the international level, guiding the U.S. Water Polo Team at the 1997 World University Games. He also served as an assistant for the 1992 National Team and as an assistant for the U.S. Water Polo Team that won gold medals at the World University Games in both 1991 and 1993. Schofield is currently serving as the president of the American Water Polo Coaches Association.

The Midshipmen compete in the Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA), which consists of 20 schools divided into northern and southern divisions. The southern division has been dominated by Navy, as it has won 17-of-21 divisional titles since 1982.

Schofield also directs the Naval Academy Aquatic Club, which produces some of the top young water polo players and swimmers in the country, many of whom have continued their careers at the Naval Academy.

Schofield graduated from Pittsburgh in 1979, where he was the captain of the water polo team and received most valuable player recognition. In 1982, Schofield arrived in Annapolis and assisted in resurrecting a water polo program that had been dormant for 32 years. He took over the head coaching duties in 1985, and his teams have enjoyed 14 20-plus win seasons, playing to an overall record of 380-145-1. Schofield has been named Eastern Coach of the Year six times including last season (1982, 1984, 1986, 1990, 2000, 2003). Last fall, Schofield added National Coach of the Year to his resume, and in March of 2004 was inducted into the United States Water Polo Hall of Fame.

Mike, his wife, Gina, and their sons, Kevin(10) and Matthew(6), reside in Arnold, Md.



PATRICK DONLIN ASSISTANT COACH FIRST YEAR UNIVERSITY OF THE PACIFIC '99



Patrick Donlin begins his first year as an assistant at the United States Naval Academy. Donlin joins the Navy staff after a standout career at University of the Pacific. A 1999 graduate of the northern California school, Donlin earned All-Mountain Pacific Sports Federation honors and All-American accolades as a senior.

Following his career with the Tigers, Donlin coached the St. Mary's High School swimming and water polo teams in Stockton, Calif. The former driver led the Rams to two sectional playoff appearances in three years before coming aboard with the Midshipmen.

Donlin is no stranger to Mike Schofield and his coaching style. A local product from Annapolis, Md., Donlin started as a member of Navy Juniors at the age of nine, and began playing water polo for Schofield at age 12. Under Schofield's tutelage, he was a two-time first team All-American in two different age divisions (15&U, 17&U), and also played in the National Championship game in the Junior Olympics in 1994. He has traveled internationally to Calgary, Canada and Mexico City, Mexico with the US National Jr. Team.

Donlin and his wife, Christine, reside in Annapolis with their sons, Charles(1) and newly arrived Lucas.

JAMES MIANTE VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH FIRST YEAR BUCKNELL UNIVERSITY '01

James Miante joins the Navy staff as a volunteer assistant this season. Like Donlin, Miante is an Annapolis native and has been involved with water polo for 12 years. He played on the Naval Academy Aquatic Club for six years before attending college.

A graduate of Bucknell University, Miante was a four-year letterwinner on the water polo squad, while also lending his skills to the swim team. While at the Lewisburg, Pa., school, he amassed 86 career goals and 102 career assists for 188 points. A four-year member of the Collegiate Water Polo Association All-Academic team, Miante has been coaching for the Naval Academy Aquatic Club since graduating in 2001. He currently serves as the Northeast Zone Developmental Coach and served as a Zone Youth Coach from 2001 until 2002.

Miante's brother, Bill, is a 2004 graduate of the Naval Academy and four year letterwinner in water polo.

COLLEGIATE WATER POLO ASSOCIATION

THE HISTORY

The Collegiate Water Polo Association originally began as the Mid Atlantic Conference, founded by Dick Russell (Bucknell University swimming & water polo coach) in the 1970s. Its founding membership included teams from Maryland, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and New York.

The leadership and management of the organization relied on volunteer coaches until 1990, when it hired a commissioner to perform basic scheduling for the 15 member teams. Officiating assignments at the time were performed by an independent organization called the Eastern Water Polo Referees Association (EWPPRA).

The next major milestone occurred in 1993, when the Southern and New England Conferences merged into the Mid Atlantic. The new structure combined all of the varsity teams in the East, along with the few sport clubs in existence at that time.

During the 1995 season, the conference received its first major challenge, as the organization experienced a strike by its officiating core. This strike ultimately resulted in the organization establishing its own officiating bureau, assuming responsibility for all of its officiating assignments. The conference hired Tere Ma as its inaugural Director of Officials and Loren Bertocci as its first Technical Director. These two individuals laid the groundwork for the Officiating Bureau that exists today.

36TH ANNUAL HAWAIIAN INVITATIONAL

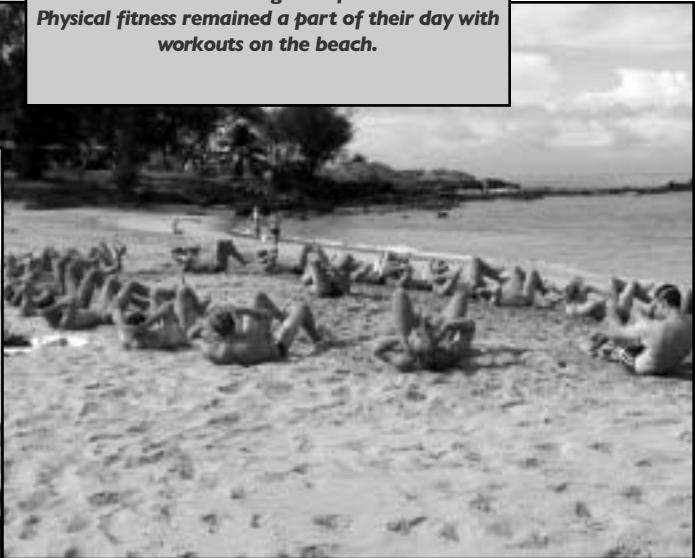
