### Aztecs Travel to the Land of Enchantment to Open 2005 Fall Campaign

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. — The San Diego State men's golf team opened its 2005 fall season with an 11th-place finish at the 51st Annual William H. Tucker Invitational at the University of New Mexico's Championship Course. After opening rounds of 288 and 300, the Aztecs closed the final day of competition with a third-round score of 296, finishing with a 20-over-par 884 for the tournament.

SDSU was paced by Andrew Scott, who was also the squad's top individual performer in six tournaments during the 2004-05 season. The Aztec senior carded a 4-over-par 220 over three rounds, placing 31st out of 104 golfers.

The tournament also marked the scarlet and black debut for a pair of transfers - junior John Gray and sophomore David Palm. Gray finished in a tie for 40th with a 5-over-par 221, while Palm completed the weekend tied for 47th after recording a 6-over-par 222.

Sophomore Aaron Goldberg turned in the Aztecs' low round of the tournament, firing a 1-under-par 71 over the first 18 holes.

UNLV's Andres Gonzales won the individual title with a 9-under-par 207, despite bogeying seven times during the final round of play. UNLV also captured the team title with a 13-under-par 851, outdistancing runner-up Brigham Young by 10 strokes.

### SDSU's David Palm and Josh Warthen Propel Aztecs To Team Title at The Club Glove Intercollegiate

SOMIS, Calif. — Bolstered by the strong play of sophomore David Palm and senior Josh Warthen, the San Diego State men's golf team secured its first tournament win of the season with a resounding victory at The Club Glove Intercollegiate at Saticoy Country Club. The Aztecs, who led the tournament wire-to-wire, carded a 29-over-par 893 to finish 16 strokes ahead of host Pepperdine.

Individually, Palm and Warthen were locked in a first-place tie after three rounds as each golfer posted a 4-over-par total of 220. Palm subsequently defeated his fellow teammate on the first playoff hole to claim the title.

SDSU's triumph marked the first time that the Aztecs captured a team event and had two golfers share medalist honors in the same competition. For Palm and Warthen, it was their first finish atop the leaderboard playing for San Diego State.

Palm caught fire early on, shooting a tournament-low 4-under-par 68 in the opening round, including a 31 on the back nine.

Warthen, meanwhile, remained in striking distance through the first two rounds before catching Palm on the final day with a 1-over-par 73 to force a playoff.

The Aztecs also received two top-20 performances from sophomore Chad Moscovic and senior Andrew Scott. Moscovic posted a 15-over-par 231 to finish in tie for 13th, while Scott tied for 16th after carding a 16-over 232.

### Aztecs Take Second at Lexus Golf Classic

FRESNO, Calif. — Fresh off of its victory earlier in the month at The Club Glove Intercollegiate, the San Diego State men's golf team appeared poised to claim its second straight tournament title at the Fresno State Lexus Golf Classic at San Joaquin Country Club. After jumping out to a three-stroke lead through the first two rounds, however, the 17th-ranked Aztecs experienced some difficulty on the final day and dropped to second place. SDSU shot a 14-over-par 298 over the final 18 holes to finish seven strokes behind first-place Denver.

Still, the Aztecs managed their third consecutive runner-up finish at the Lexus Classic and have never placed out of the top five at the tournament dating back to the 1999-2000 season.

San Diego State was led by Andrew Scott, who finished in a tie for sixth place with a 3-over-par 216. The Aztec senior was also the team's top golfer in SDSU's previous two appearances at the Lexus Classic, posting consecutive second-place finishes in 2003 and 2004.

Joining Scott in the top 10 were sophomore Aaron Goldberg and junior John Gray, as each player carded a 4-over 220 to finish tied for seventh.

Sophomore David Palm and senior Josh Warthen, who shared co-medalist honors at The Club Glove Intercollegiate on Oct. 4, tied for 23rd at 8-over 221.

### SDSU Men's Golf Finishes Fourth at Barona Collegiate Cup

LAKESIDE, Calif. - Playing host to its only tournament of the season, the San Diego State men's golf team turned in a fourth-place performance against a highly competitive field of 18 teams at the Barona Collegiate Cup at Barona Creek Golf Club. The two-day tournament featured nationally ranked squads in Brigham Young, Louisville, Missouri and Texas Tech, with BYU winning the team title. The Aztecs finished 16 strokes off the pace with a 26-under-par 838.

Following a slow start, SDSU caught fire in the second round, vaulting from 11th place into a tie for fifth after shooting an 11-under-par 277. Although the Aztecs carded the same score over the final 18 holes, they could only move up one more spot in the standings, settling for fourth overall.

SDSU had three golfers post red figures for all three rounds, paced by Josh Warthen's 8-under 208. The Aztec senior completed the tournament with consecutive rounds of 69 and 68 to finish in a tie for 14th place.

Following two straight rounds of 71, sophomore David Palm carded a team-best 5-under 67 on the final day of competition, tying for 17th. Fellow classmate Aaron Goldberg also saved his best for last, firing a third-round 69 to finish in a tie for 27th.

Senior Andrew Scott found himself in a tie for 31st after posting a final score of 4-under 212.

### Aztecs' Scott Shares Medalist Honors in Hawaii

KANEHOE, Hawaii - The 18th-ranked San Diego State men's golf team closed out the fall portion of its 2005-06 campaign in impressive fashion with a third-place effort at the University of Hawai'i Fall Intercollegiate at Kaneohe Klipper Golf Course. The Aztecs logged their fourth consecutive top-five team finish of the season after carding a 12-over-par 876 for the tournament. SDSU spent the first two rounds in fourth place, before overtaking Baylor in the standings on the final day. New Mexico State captured the team title with a 7-over 871, one shot ahead of runner-up UNLV.

Andrew Scott led the Aztecs, finishing in a four-way tie atop the leaderboard with a 2-under-par 214, along with Ryan Baca of Baylor, New Mexico State's Robert Goff and Seung-su Han of UNLV. With his performance, Scott posted his highest tournament finish since winning the Southern California Intercollegiate in the spring of 2003. His effort also helped him garner co-golfer of the month honors from the Mountain West Conference for November.

Scott began the tournament in 14th place before making his move over the next two rounds. On the second day, the senior from Henderson, Nev., jumped into a tie for second place on the strength of his team-low 3-under 69, before finding himself in a logjam with the other three leaders after the final 18 holes.

The rest of the SDSU contingent also improved their positions on the leaderboard during the final day of competition. Sophomore Aaron Goldberg and senior Josh Warthen each moved up three spots to finish in a tie for 12th and 23rd, respectively, while sophomore David Palm jumped 14 places to tie for 25th.

The biggest improvement, however, was made by sophomore Chad Moscovic, who climbed from 57th into a tie for 30th. Moscovic closed the tournament by shaving seven strokes off of his first round 78.

### SDSU Golfers Return to Aloha State to Open Spring Season

WAHIAWA, Hawaii - The San Diego State men's golf squad picked up right where it left off last fall, returning to Hawaii to post its fifth straight top-five finish of the year at the John Burns Intercollegiate at Leilehua Golf Course. The 18th-ranked Aztecs opened their spring season placing fourth among an elite field of 19 teams by shooting a 33-under-par 831. SMU took control of the third round to claim the overall team title with a 41-under 823, edging BYU by a slim one-stroke margin. New Mexico, SDSU and Colorado State rounded out the top five.

For the fourth time in six outings, senior Andrew Scott commanded the Aztecs' charge, completing all three rounds in the red to finish in a tie for third place out of 106 golfers. Scott's final score of 13-under-par 203 included a career- and tournament-best 8-under 64 during the second round of action, which ranks as the second lowest 18-hole score in SDSU history.

Sophomore David Palm vaulted from 58th place into a 12-way tie for 25th after carding a 5-under 67 in the third round. Senior Josh Warthen also made a move on the final day, climbing 11 spots from 48th into a tie for 37th with a 5-under 211.

Sophomore Aaron Goldberg was the fourth Aztec to break par for the tournament, finishing in a tie for 42nd with a 3-under 213.

After carding a 68 on the opening day, junior John Gray could not overcome a tough second round after shooting a 6-over 78 to finish in a tie for 79th overall with a 3-over 219.

### Aztecs' Goldberg Places Seventh at Ashworth Collegiate

WESTLAKE VILLAGE, Calif. - The San Diego State men's golf team saw its streak of five straight top-five tournament finishes come to a frustrating end at the University of Southern California's Ashworth Collegiate Invitational at North Ranch Country Club. Plagued by soggy conditions, the 19th-ranked Aztecs posted a final score of 43-over-par 895 to finish in 12th place. Pepperdine was the only school to break par at the 15-team event, posting a 3-under 861 to take the team title by nine strokes over host USC.

SDSU was already in early trouble when second-round action was suspended by rain. After play resumed on the final day, the Aztecs' fortunes went from bad to worse as the scarlet and black logged a season-high round of 23-over-par 307. SDSU regrouped over the final 18 holes, recording a 4-over 288, but was unable to make up ground in the standings.

The Aztecs were led for the first time this season by sophomore Aaron Goldberg, who shot an even-par 71 during the final round to move up seven spots from 14th place into a three-way tie for seventh. Goldberg opened with two 1-over par rounds and finished with a 2-over 215 for the tournament.

Sophomore David Palm was the lone SDSU golfer to break par in any of the three rounds, carding a 1-under 70 over the final 18 holes on the strength of five birdies. Palm shook off a second-round 80 to jump 13 places from 61st into a tie for 48th with an overall score of 14-over 227.

Senior Andrew Scott suffered the opposite fate, however, dropping from 36th to 46th. Scott struggled during the third round, bogeying five times en route to a 13-over 226.

Rounding out the Aztec contingent was senior Josh Warthen and sophomore Jamie Puterbaugh, who finished in 59th and 75th, respectively.

### SDSU Rebounds to Capture Second Tournament Title of the Season

RANCHO SANTA FE, Calif. - Overcoming a lackluster performance two weeks ago at the Ashworth Intercollegiate, the San Diego State men's golf team rebounded in grand fashion with a come-from-behind victory at the Callaway Golf Invitational at The Farms Golf Club. The Aztecs captured their second tournament title of the season, surging past cross-town rival San Diego by 12 strokes with a 16-over-par 880. Following the leaders were San Jose State and Loyola Marymount, which finished in a tie for third, while Long Beach State and California tied for the fifth spot.

After grabbing a first-round lead, the Aztecs watched as tournament host USD caught fire, jumping from the seventh position to take a one-shot lead over the scarlet and black after the second round. SDSU responded to the Toreros' charge, however, carding a tournament-low 288 as a team over the final 18 holes to win going away.

Senior Andrew Scott led the Aztecs for the fifth time in 2005-06, posting a runner-up finish with a 2-under-par 214. Scott tallied his eighth sub-par round of the year, shooting a 1-under 71 on the final day. The Henderson, Nev., native also recorded his fifth round of the season in the 60s when he fired a 3-under 69 to open the tournament.

Sophomore Cory Segall logged his best collegiate finish since a second-place effort at the 2003 Husky Invitational, tying for sixth with a 5-over 221. Two shots behind Segall were fellow classmates David Palm and Aaron Goldberg, who both carded a 7-over 223 to tie for 10th with four other golfers.

Senior Josh Warthen, meanwhile, shook off some early trouble, recording a 1-over 73 during the final round to finish in a tie for 37th with a 230.

### Aztec Golfers Claim Second Straight Tournament Win

JUNCTION CITY, Ore. - Fresh off of its triumph at the Callaway Golf Invitational, the San Diego State men's golf team captured its second straight tournament title at the Oregon Duck Invitational at Shadow Hills Country Club. The Aztecs outpaced runner-up Nevada by an impressive 12-shot margin, shooting a 10-under-par 854 en route to their third tournament win of the season. The victory was also SDSU's second Duck Invitational championship in three years after winning at the same course in 2003.

The Aztecs had three golfers post red figures for the tournament, led by sophomore Aaron Goldberg's 4-under 212. The Encinitas, Calif., product notched his third straight top-10 finish, tying for third place on rounds of 71-70-71. Goldberg was in contention from the start, but wound up just one stroke behind the leaders, Joe Panzeri of Washington and Washington State's Ryan Witz.

Senior Andrew Scott placed in the top five for the fourth time in 2005-06 after firing a 2-under 214, tying for fifth with with five other players. One shot in back of Scott was fellow classmate Josh Warthen, who ended in a tie for 11th with a 1-under 215. Sophomore David Palm, meanwhile, jumped up six spots on the final day, tying for 20th with a 3-over 219.

SDSU also received a notable contribution from sophomore Cory Segall, who carded an Aztec-low 4-under 68 during the second round, helping the scarlet and black surge past Oregon State in the team standings by seven shots. The La Jolla native tied for 31st with an 8-over 224.

Junior Jason Puterbaugh made the trip north as an unattached golfer, finishing in a tie for 36th with a 9-over 225.

### SDSU's Bid For Third Straight Tournament Title Comes Up Just Short

TEMPE, Ariz. - The 22nd-ranked San Diego State men's golf team saw its hopes for a third straight tournament victory come to a disappointing end at Arizona State's Thunderbird Invitational at ASU Karsten Golf Course. Despite having four players finish below par, the Aztecs had to settle for a third-place tie with Kansas State after shooting a 17-under-par 835. Arizona overcame a nine-shot deficit with a furious rally on the final day to claim the team title, one stroke ahead of UNLV and five in front of both SDSU and KSU.

Had the Aztecs held on for the victory, San Diego State would have captured three consecutive tournament wins for the first time since the 2001-02 season.

Individually, sophomore Aaron Goldberg recorded his lowest score as an Aztec since the 2003 U.S. Intercollegiate, firing a 6-under 207 to finish alone in fifth place for his second straight top-five showing. During the second round, Goldberg carded a 6-under 65, which tied him for third on SDSU's all-time list for lowest 18-hole score.

Right behind Goldberg was sophomore David Palm, who posted his lowest total as a member of the scarlet and black with a 5-under 208 to finish in a tie for sixth. Palm also found the magic touch in the second round, shooting an Aztec career-best 5-under 66, which ranks as the seventh-lowest 18-hole score in school history.

Seniors Andrew Scott and Josh Warthen tied for 19th with three other golfers after completing the tournament with a 1-under 212. Sophomore Cory Segall also competed in the event, finishing in a tie for 28th out of 83 individuals with a 1-over 214.

### Aztec Golfers Tie for Sixth at Rain-Shortened U.S. Intercollegiate

STANFORD, Calif. - One week after experiencing Arizona's favorable desert climate, the 17th-ranked San Diego State men's golf team was hampered by showery conditions in Northern California, finishing in a tie for sixth at the U.S. Intercollegiate presented by The Maple Fund. The Aztecs shot a 34-over-par 594 over two rounds at a waterlogged Stanford Golf Course as the final day of competition was cancelled due to torrential rains. UCLA was declared the winner after two rounds, posting an 18-over 578, followed by Southern California (+19) and host school Stanford (+20).

Individually, senior Josh Warthen missed out on a top-10 finish by one stroke, but still led the Aztecs for the first time this spring after carding a 5-over 145 to tie for 12th. Fellow classmate Andrew Scott finished three shots behind Warthen, tying for 23rd with an 8-over 148.

Sophomore Aaron Goldberg, who won the event as a true freshman in 2004, tied for 43rd with an 11-over 151. Another sophomore, Chad Moscovic, saw his first action of the spring, finishing in a tie for 46th with a 12-over 152.

The inclement weather in the Bay Area wreaked havoc with most of the field as only 15 out of 188 individual rounds were played at or below par.

SDSU's sixth-place showing marked the first time the Aztecs have finished out of the top five at the U.S. Intercollegiate since the 2001-02 campaign when they finished ninth out of 17 teams.

### SDSU Takes Second at MWC Championships

SUNRIVER, Ore. - The 21st-ranked San Diego State men's golf team rebounded from a slow start to post a second-place finish at the 2006 Mountain West Conference championships at Crosswater Golf Course. The Aztecs shot a 6-over-par 870, placing four golfers in the top 20 en route to their third runner-up performance in the past six years. New Mexico captured its fourth straight league title with a 1-over 865, while UNLV (+10), Brigham Young (+14) and TCU (+18) rounded out the top five.

Things looked bleak for SDSU early on, as the scarlet and black fell 10 shots off the pace after the first round with a 6-over 294. The Aztecs responded with a tournament-best 8-under 280 on the second day to climb from the fifth spot into second place. San Diego State entered the final round just seven shots behind New Mexico, but could only narrow the gap by two strokes as the Lobos held on for the victory.

Andrew Scott recorded his best-ever finish in the MWC tournament, tying for second with an even-par 216. During the final round, the Aztec senior was alone in first place on the back nine when untimely bogeys on the 13th, 14th and 18th holes knocked him out of the lead and into a tie for second with TCU's Tom Miles. UNM's Jay Choi took home medalist honors with a 1-under 215.

Sophomore Aaron Goldberg and senior Josh Warthen each carded a 4-over 220 for the tournament to finish in a five-way tie for 14th.

Despite shooting a 6-over 78 on the final day, sophomore David Palm still managed a top-20 finish, placing 19th with a 5-over 221. Palm and Warthen each notched a team-low 3-under 69 during the second round.

Junior John Gray came back to lead all Aztec golfers with a 1-under 71 on the final day. Gray finished in a tie for 37th with an 18-over 234 in his first varsity action since February.

Following the tournament, the league announced its 11-member all-conference team, which included Scott and Goldberg.

### Aztec Golfers Come Up Short at NCAA Regional

**TUCSON, Ariz.** - The San Diego State men's golf team saw its 2005-06 season come to a disappointing end after finishing in a tie for 17th place out of 27 teams at the NCAA West Regional in Tucson, Ariz. Although the Aztecs posted the 10th-best score during the third and final round at the Omni Tucson National Golf Club, it wasn't enough as the scarlet and black came up short in its quest for a second consecutive trip to the NCAA Championships.

After failing to break par in the first two rounds, SDSU shot 5-under-par over the final 18 holes to complete the 54-hole tournament at 2-under-par. The Aztecs got to 7-under-par, within one shot of 12th place at one point on the back nine, but were unable to muster their way into the top 10.

Arizona and Florida shared the team title at 37-under-par, 13 shots clear of the rest of the field, while Florida's Billy Horschel and Nevada's Casey Watabu finished tied atop the individual leaderboard at 13-under-par. San Diego State was led by sophomores David Palm and Aaron Goldberg as each carded a 2-under 214 to finish in a tie for 46th place out of 141 golfers.

Palm tallied five birdies to go along with three bogeys during third-round action on the way to his second consecutive score of 2-under-par 70. Goldberg also recorded his second sub-par round on the final day of the tournament, firing a 1-under 71.

Senior Andrew Scott, meanwhile, played a bogey-free round en route to a team-best 4-under-par 68. Scott drained birdies on three of the four par-5 holes and finished with an even-par 216 for the championship.

Rounding out the scoring for the Aztecs was sophomore Cory Segall whose third-round total was good enough to count for the second straight day. Segall birdied the 18th hole to finish with a 2-over-par 74.

### The Barona Collegiate Cup

Each year the San Diego State men's golf program plays host to one of the premier events in the country, the Barona Collegiate Cup. Since 2001, the tournament has been held every fall at the 7,088-yard, par-72 Barona Creek Golf Club in Lakeside, Calif. Nestled in a scenic valley on the Barona Indian Reservation, the challenging, world-class golf course attracts a field of national championship contenders on an annual basis.

In 2005, the competition featured No. 15 Brigham Young, 17th-ranked SDSU, No. 24 Louisville, as well as top-75 teams in Texas Tech, Missouri, Nevada and Kansas State.

BYU led the 54-hole tournament wire-to-wire to successfully defend its team title from the year before. Coincidentally, the Cougars carded the same score as they did in 2004, shooting an impressive 42-under-par 822 to finish 12 shots ahead of runner-up Fresno State (-30).

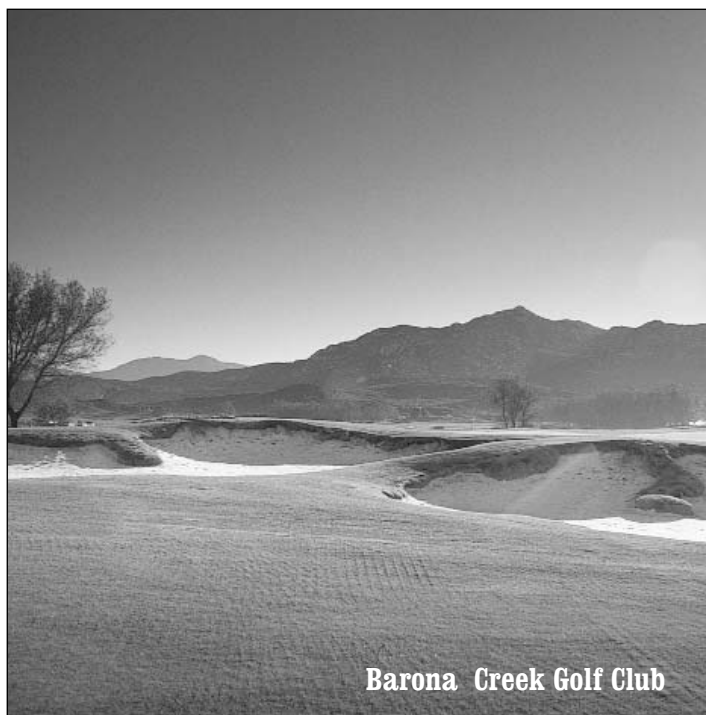
The next four teams on the leaderboard finished within five shots of one another, as Louisville (-27), SDSU (-26), Texas Tech (-22) and Denver (-22) rounded out the top five.

One year after losing the individual title on the second playoff hole, James Love of Denver took care of business in regulation in 2005, firing a 15-under 201 to win by three strokes over BYU's Clay Ogden and San Diego's Luke Antonelli.

Josh Warthen was SDSU's top finisher, tying for 14th with an 8-under 208. The Aztec senior notched his second-best round of the season after shooting a 4-under 68 over the final 18 holes.

San Diego State has finished among the top 10 at the Barona Collegiate Cup in four of the past five years, including winning the team championship in 2002. That season, the Aztecs' John Lepak shared co-medalist honors after carding a 10-under 206, which tied him for third on the school's all-time list for lowest 54-hole score.

In addition to BYU's and SDSU's team titles, Colorado State was victorious at the tournament in 2003 with a 28-under 836, while Ohio State carded an identical score to capture the inaugural event in 2001 by one shot over San Diego State.
