## 2000 BIG 12 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

Friday - Sunday • April 21-23 • Lubbock, Texas

### Texas Tech Hosts 2000 Big 12 Championships *Red Raiders look for fourth straight NCAA Tournament bid.*

**LUBBOCK, Texas** – Texas Tech will serve as host of the 2000 Big 12 Conference Women's Golf Championships this weekend at the Lubbock Country Club (par 72, 6,138 yards). The 54-hole tournament tees off at 8 a.m. each day and begins with 18 holes on Friday, followed by 18 holes on Saturday and Sunday.

Boasting some of the best women's golf in the country, the Big 12 Conference currently has eight of its 12 teams ranked among the nation's top 50. Tournament favorite Oklahoma State is ranked seventh in the most recent MasterCard Collegiate Golf rankings. Texas (15), Oklahoma (26), Missouri (29), Texas Tech (30), Texas A&M (33), Nebraska (38) and Baylor (43) also are ranked.

On the line for the Red Raiders is not only the opportunity to win a conference championship, but also a bid to the NCAA Regional Tournament in Victoria, Texas, in May.

"I guess you can say this is it," Texas Tech Director of Golf Jeff Mitchell said. "If we finish well, we will probably get in the NCAA Tournament. Being on our home course should be an advantage. We have played here many times and know the course well.

"The scenario is down to how we fare with Texas A&M and Missouri," Mitchell added. "Oklahoma State, Oklahoma, Texas, Nebraska and Baylor are in by my figures. We certainly hold our fate in our own hands."

Texas Tech is 26-21 against Big 12 competition this season and has defeated every team at least once, except for Oklahoma State.

**Jamie Vannoy** (Sandy, Ore.) has been the most consistent performer for Texas Tech all season. She leads the team with a 76.4 stroke per round average and ranks seventh in the Big 12. Vannoy has seven top 20 finishes this season, including two in the top five. Her last two finishes entering this weekend's event are a tie for third at the Utah-Dixie Classic and a seventh-place finish at the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic.

"Jamie Vannoy has been playing some of the smartest golf of her career," Mitchell said. "The rest of the squad are providing the good rounds when we need them. They have all taken it pretty low in the last three tournaments. We just have to put it together all at the same time."

**Stephanie Dukes** (N. Richland Hills, Texas) had been struggling during the spring until she posted an eighth-place finish in her last outing. She is second on the team with a 78.2 stroke average. **Melanie Hunt** (Phoenix, Ariz.) and **Jennifer Newhouse** (Bryan, Texas) are each averaging 78.7 strokes per round, while **Priscillia Hunt** (Phoenix, Ariz.) rounds out Tech's top five with a 78.9 stroke average.

The three-day, 54-hole event will consist of 18 holes of play each day. Action begins each day at 8 a.m. (CDT). There will be five golfers representing each school, but only four golfers' scores will count toward the team total.

## TEXAS TECH FINISHES STRONG IN REGULAR SEASON

After finishing in the top five in two of its first six tournaments this season, the Red Raiders posted three-consecutive top five finishes to close out the regular season. In the first outing of the spring, Texas Tech finished 7<sup>th</sup> at the 2000 GTE "Mo"romial in Houston. Since then, the Red Raiders have been on a tear. The team finished fifth at the Rainbow Wahine Classic behind four top 20 teams and second at the Utah-Dixie Classic behind Oklahoma State. In their last outing, the Red Raiders claimed the fourth-place spot at the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic in Norman, Okla.

## TECH SETS SCHOOL RECORDS AT UTAH-DIXIE CLASSIC

Texas Tech's three-round 895 at the Utah-Dixie Classic established a new school record for tournament strokes. In the same event, the Red Raiders set the school record for single-round strokes with a 292.

## VANNOY BREAKS THREE-ROUND RECORD

Senior Jamie Vannoy shot a three-round 218 at the Utah-Dixie Classic, breaking the old three-round record of 219, set by Brooke Lowrance at last season's Big 12 Conference Championships.

## HIGH FIVE

Texas Tech has finished in the top five in five different tournaments this season.

## IN THE POLLS

Texas Tech is ranked 30<sup>th</sup> in the latest edition of the MasterCard Collegiate Rankings. The ranking is the highest of the season for the Red Raiders.

## BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

Oklahoma State won the Big 12 title a year ago and is looking to be the first repeat champion since the inception of the league in 1996. Texas won the first event in 1997, followed by Texas A&M and OSU. The medalist in each tournament came from the top place school.

## LAST YEAR'S BIG 12 CHAMPIONSHIPS

Oklahoma State's Maria Boden and Texas Tech's Brooke Lowrance went into a playoff with Boden claiming medalist honors. Beth Covington and Jamie Vannoy followed Lowrance in 18<sup>th</sup> and 22<sup>nd</sup> positions, while Jennifer Newhouse finished in 25<sup>th</sup> place. Heather Wrede closed out the scoring for Tech in 38<sup>th</sup> place.

## LAST TIME OUT FOR TEXAS TECH

The Red Raiders finished fourth in the Susie Maxwell Berning Classic in Norman, Okla. Jamie Vannoy and Stephanie Dukes led Tech with seventh and eighth place finishes, respectively. Jennifer Newhouse finished 32<sup>nd</sup>, Heather Wrede finished 36<sup>th</sup>, Priscillia Hunt came in 40<sup>th</sup> and Melanie Hunt closed out the scoring for Tech in 48<sup>th</sup> place. The tournament finish was Tech's third-straight top five finish.

## TEXAS TECH HEAD COACH JEFF MITCHELL

Red Raider head coach Jeff Mitchell is in his 10<sup>th</sup> and final season as head coach of the Red Raider women's golf program. He was named Texas Tech Director of Golf two seasons ago, assuming both head coaching duties for the men and women. Mitchell recently was named head coach of the men's program at Stanford University.

During his 10 years with the women's program, Mitchell has taken the program to new heights. The team has advanced to NCAA Tournament play four of the last five years.

Mitchell played collegiately at Texas Tech from 1974-76. He was an All-Southwest Conference selection and was named All-America in 1976. In 1978 Mitchell defeated Ben Crenshaw in a sudden death playoff in the Texas State Open. His biggest thrill was yet to come. Mitchell won the 1980 Phoenix Open on the PGA Tour by four strokes.
