UCLA FOOTBALL FACTS

- **Only 10 other schools in the nation have won as many bowl games as UCLA (11) over the last 24 years.** (Among those schools, UCLA's winning percentage of .647 ranks fifth).
- **UCLA has more bowl wins (11) in the last 24 years than any other school in the Pac-10.**
- **No other school in the Pac-10 has more final Associated Press Top 25 rankings than the Bruins over the last 24 years.**
- **Only 11 schools, none from the Pac-10, have been ranked in the Top 10 more often than UCLA in the last 24 seasons.**

- **73,709 fans per game saw UCLA at the Rose Bowl in 1998, a figure which led the Pac-10.** (UCLA has ranked first, second or third in the Pac-10 in attendance in five of the last eight years).
- **Two Outland Trophy winners in the last decade have called UCLA home — Jonathan Ogden '95; Kris Farris '98.** (UCLA has produced three first-team All-America tackles — Ogden in 1995, Chad Overhauser in 1997 and Farris in 1998 — in that span).

Pac-10 history are Bruins. (ILB Jerry Robinson and S Kenny Easley are the only two in the nation since SMU's Doak Walker (1947-48-49). They have both been inducted into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame and the UCLA Athletics Hall of Fame).

- **147 of UCLA's last 155 games have been on live television.** (All 12 of UCLA's games in '05, Eleven of 12 games '04, 12 of 13 in '03, all 13 in '02, all 11 in '01, 11 of 12 in '00, 10 of 11 in '99 and all 12 of UCLA's games in '98 appeared on live television).
- **470,961 fans, a school-record total, saw UCLA play at the Rose Bowl in 2000.**

- **UCLA has produced a 1,000-yard rusher in seven of the last 12 seasons.** (Two others rushed for at least 900 yards. In addition, UCLA has produced three first-team All-America tailbacks — Karim Abdul-Jabbar in 1995, Skip Hicks in 1997 and Maurice Drew in 2005 (kick returner)—and four first-team All-Pac-10 tailbacks — Abdul-Jabbar, Hicks and DeShaun Foster in 2000 and 2001 — in that span).
- **The only three-time consensus All-Americans in**

- **Eight Bruin players and three coaches have been elected to the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. Four Bruins, including 2006 inductee Troy Aikman, are in the Pro Football Hall of Fame.**
- **UCLA's eight-game winning streak against USC between 1991 and 1998 is the longest in the history of the series.**
- **Sixteen Bruin football players have earned NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarships.** (Five — Carlton Gray in 1992, George Kase in 1995, Chris Sailer and Shawn Stuart in 1998 and Danny Farmer in 1999 — in the last 14 seasons).
- **Seventeen UCLA football players have been selected to CoSIDA Academic All-America teams.**
- **UCLA had four players selected in the 2005 NFL Draft and three picked in the 2006 Draft.**
- **UCLA has produced 12 No. 1 selections in the last 19 National Football League drafts.** (Mercedes Lewis in 2006, Robert Thomas in 2002, Freddie Mitchell in 2001, Cade McNown in 1999, Shaun Williams in 1998, Jonathan Ogden in 1996, J.J. Stokes in 1995, Jamir Miller in 1994, Tommy Maddox in 1992, Eric Turner in 1991, Troy Aikman in 1989 and Gaston Green in 1988).
- **UCLA is the only school to produce five quarterbacks who have played in the Super Bowl.** (Troy Aikman, Steve Bono, Billy Kilmer, Tom Ramsey and Jay Schroeder)
- **UCLA defensive lineman Mike Lodish is the only player in NFL history to appear in six Super Bowls.**
- **UCLA's Troy Aikman was the first quarterback to lead his team to three Super Bowl victories in a four-year span.**
- **UCLA linebacker Ken Norton, Jr. is the only man in NFL history to play for three straight Super Bowl champions.**
- **UCLA has had at least one former player participate in the Super Bowl in 26 of the last 27 games.**
- **UCLA was the first school to win a bowl game in seven consecutive seasons (1982-88).**
