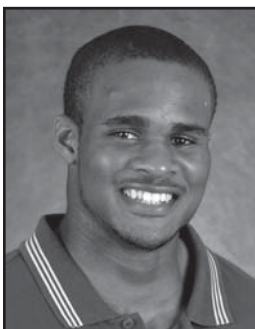

UCLA — Kahlil is expected to battle Chris Markey for the starting tailback position ... He is the best pass protector among the Bruin backs and is one of the more physical backs in the Pac-10 Conference ... A big, strong runner with deceptive speed.

2005 — Had a solid true freshman campaign as the team's No. 3 tailback and kickoff return man ... Continued to improve throughout the season culminating with a co-MVP award at the Sun Bowl where he gained 136 yards ... At San Diego State, in his first game, he ran for 17 yards ... Ran for 44 yards and his first career touchdown versus Rice ... Against Oregon State, he accounted for 41 yards, including one run of 27 yards ... He had 20 yards at Arizona, 25 versus Arizona State and 20 at USC ... 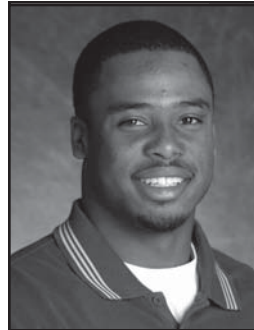
